OFFICERS

MOVITE has been working toward to a new Executive Board structure since 2006 to better serve the section's membership. The new plan will eliminate two of the three "board" director positions and replace them with six state directors, one for each MOVITE state. These state directors will not automatically advance up to the executive board, as is the case with the board directors. Rather these new state directors serve two-year terms. This new structure will allow for greater involvement of our membership in leadership positions, put more leadership at the local level, and shorten the progression through the executive board from 8 years to 6 years. The new structure will include one State Director representing each member state in addition to the Board positions: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Director, and Past President.

The first "transition" election was held in the fall of 2008 for the State Board Directors from Iowa, Nebraska and Missouri. Each new State Director's responsibilities are dependent on the states that they serve, so each new State Director started their tenure by writing a "business plan" for their position. These plans were approved by our board at the fall meeting. The directors for Kansas, Oklahoma, and Arkansas were elected in the fall of 2009 to begin their terms on the board in 2010. LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITIES

From the legislative perspective there were a number of very busy states in the MOVITE Section during 2009. Issues ranged from primary seat belt laws to transportation funding, to red light cameras, speed limits and graduated licensing. The following list includes just a few of the initiatives that were under consideration:

Kansas

Below is a brief summary of the bills that were under consideration in Kansas. A full text of the bills, voting history, and or other information about the legislature is posted at www.kslegislature.org.

Primary Seat Belt Law (SB 59): This bill would require every occupant of a passenger vehicle to wear a safety belt and to allow a law enforcement officer to stop a vehicle for violations of safety belt requirements.

Current state law does not require adults in the back seat to wear safety belts, and a law enforcement officer can stop a vehicle and issue a citation for failure to wear a safety belt only if another law has been violated. The fine would be \$25 plus a docket fee amount is \$75. This bill passed the Kansas Senate.

Graduated Driver License (Substitute for HB 2143): This bill modifies the requirements for driving permits and drivers' licenses for drivers younger than 17 years old. This bill passed the Kansas House. The Senate Transportation Committee recommended the bill to the Senate.

Keep Right Except to Pass (SB 145): SB 145 requires vehicles to drive in the right lane on rural 4-lane divided expressways and freeways. It also requires vehicles on highways with three or more lane proceeding in the same direction not to be driving in the far left lane. Exceptions apply to both cases when a vehicle is: overtaking and passing another vehicle, preparing to make a proper left turn, otherwise

directed by official traffic-control devices. This bill passed both chambers.

Move It, Removal of Vehicles (HB 2147): This bill passed both houses of the legislature. HB 2147 requires the driver or owner of a vehicle involved in a non-injury, non-fatal crash to make every reasonable effort to move the vehicle out of the roadway, if that vehicle should be moved safely and without causing damage to the vehicle, the roadway, or other vehicles or person. The fine for failing to remove vehicles involved in crashes would be \$60. This bill passed both chambers.

NEBRASKA

Nebraska's effort to pass a Primary Seatbelt Law: On January 9, 2009, Nebraska Senator Harms introduced LB106, a legislative bill that would change Nebraska's secondary seat belt law to a primary law (allowing law enforcement to pull over drivers who aren't wearing seat belts). Currently, drivers can be ticketed for not wearing seat belts, but only if they have first been pulled over for other infractions. MOVITE members in Nebraska actively supported this bill.

Local Public Agencies (LPA) Guidelines Manual: The Nebraska Department of Roads has been busy developing the Local Public Agencies (LPA) Guidelines Manual for Federal Aid Projects. Version 1.00 was released in May. As the version number indicates, it is currently being viewed as a living document. The manual documents federal and state laws and regulations. Its intent is to guide LPAs in planning, organizing, designing, constructing, and maintaining facilities while seeking federal funds.

MISSOURI

Primary Seatbelt Law: MOVITE and its chapters were very active in 2009 trying to encourage the state legislature to pass a primary seatbelt law in Missouri. The membership undertook an active campaign sending hundreds of letters to elected officials. Many of the MOVITE chapters became Primary Safety Belt Partners (http://www.savemolives.com/). Letters sent to elected officials stated:

I am a member of the Institute of Transportation Engineers. Founded in 1930, we are an international association of over 17,000 transportation professionals who are responsible for meeting our nation's mobility and safety needs. As a member of this esteemed organization I am greatly involved in transportation and safety on our roads. I strongly support the primary safety belt law that Missouri is trying to pass.

A primary safety belt law would save lives in Missouri <u>without costing taxpayers anything</u>. In fact, it would <u>secure over \$16 million in grant money</u> for safety enforcement, education and engineering that would otherwise be lost at the end of 2009. Furthermore, it is estimated that a primary safety belt law would <u>save 90 lives a year</u> and prevent more than 1,000 serious injuries.

The need for such a law is borne out by the following statistics:

- Missouri's safety belt use rate is currently one of the lowest in the nation only 75% of Missourians are buckling up.
 The rate for young drivers is even lower only 58% on average.
- Safety belts are the single best way to help prevent death and injury in a vehicle crash.
- People who don't wear safety belts become projectiles in a crash and a danger to others in their vehicles.
- In the last three years, 68% of the people who died in Missouri traffic crashes were not wearing a safety belt.
- Eight out of ten teens that died in Missouri crashes were not wearing their safety belts.
- Statistics show that if drivers wear their safety belts, so do their children. According to a recent Missouri survey, when the driver was belted, 94% of the children were also restrained. When the driver was not belted, 42% of the children were unrestrained.

The law would also lower costs to the taxpayers through lower degrees of personal injuries, lower Medicaid costs, and grant money that will make our highways safer.

Let's save lives in Missouri – that's the true motivation for strengthening the state's safety belt law. Of any single piece of legislation, a primary safety belt law has the greatest potential for saving the most lives. Please do your part to support a stronger safety belt law.

2009 Economic Recovery: Missouri was the first state in the nation to begin construction on highway projects funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). The minute President Obama signed the economic recovery bill, MoDOT went to work to replace one of the state's oldest and most rickety bridges, the Osage River Bridge near Tuscumbia. Additional road, bridge, air, rail, transit, pedestrian and bicycle projects will be under way in the coming months. SECTION MEETINGS

Given our large geographic area, MOVITE traditionally holds two section-wide meetings each year. However, this is only a small part of the activities took place in our Section in 2009. We also sponsor or otherwise participate in other meetings such as the Annual Traffic and Safety Conference held each year in Columbia, Missouri. Many of our events also hosted through our Chapters; which collectively held 48 events in 2009. Finally, in 2009, MOVITE hosted its first annual "University Showcase" to bring together those interested in transportation related research. Collectively, MOVITE and its chapters hosted more than 50 separate meetings/conferences/events in 2009.

A Green Conference

The conference theme — Smarter, Safer, Sustainable - was evidenced by the efforts made by the LAC. The group followed the EPA's Meeting Guide, implementing a number of environmentally friendly strategies, including:

- Minimizing printed materials
- Encouraging carpooling to and from Springfield
- Selecting walkable locations for nearly all events and encouraging walking during the conference

A Star-Studded Affair

The Annual Meeting was a celebrity-heavy event, as the various conference stages were filled with wellknown members of the transportation community, entertainment, and politics.

From ITE, we were pleased to welcome **Paul Eng-Wong**, 2010 International President and **Siva Narla**, Chief Engineer and ITS Standards Senior Director. Additional international level guest speakers spoke on a wide variety of transportation topics.

Additional celebrity sightings included former President George W. Bush, guest speaker at the Past President's Breakfast, as well as Shania Twain, Cher, and Sonny Bono (who bore a striking resemblance to **Shawn Leight**) at the Awards Banquet.

Pre-Conference Events

Beginning with a Missouri State University football game on Saturday evening, the Annual Meeting started early. On Sunday participants could choose from PTOE and PTP refresher courses and the annual MOVITE golf tournament. Later that evening an auction and Texas Hold-em Tournament were held to benefit the Student Scholarship Fund. Over \$1,000 was raised for the cause.

Technical Sessions

The list of technical presentations was impressive. Paul Eng-Wong's address kicked off the meeting, followed by a plan for road-use pricing presented by **Bern Grush** of Skymeter Corporation. Morning

breakout sessions included topics on traffic signals, International transportation safety efforts, and the first Diverging Diamond Interchange in North America.



The luncheon speaker, **Ken Rutherford**, silenced the crowd. After losing both legs to a landmine in Somalia, Ken co-founded Survivor Corps (formerly the Landmine Survivors Network), led a Nobel Peace Prize-winning coalition, testified before congress, and authored *Humanitarianism Under Fire: The US and UN intervention in Somalia*. Ken spoke of his experiences in humanitarian efforts, including a trip to Bosnia in 1997 with Princess Diana.

Afternoon breakouts included presentations on ITS evaluations, frontage roads, colorblindness in transportation, and the Safe Routes to School Program. Plenary sessions finished the technical portion of Monday, including:

- Greg Ostergen Insurance Industry Safety Initiatives
- Richard Retting -Red Light Camera Experience
- ▶ Hibbett Neel. ITE Cannons of Ethics

Sustainability was the focus on Tuesday morning, with sessions held in a round-table format. After a presentation by **Gerry Schwartz**, participants broke out into small-table discussions. Specific topics included alternative fuels, low-impact development, recycling in construction, and downtown revitalization.

The Closing Keynote Address was provided by **Phil Tarnoff** of the Center for Integrated Transportation System Management. Phil discussed Intelligent Transportation Systems.






The reasons for hosting a Green Meeting are as follows:

2009 Annual Chapter Report



Executive Summary

The Kansas City Chapter of ITE marked its sixth full year as an organization in 2009. KCITE further established itself in 2009 as the organization of choice for transportation professionals in the Kansas City metropolitan area. The bi-monthly chapter meetings were well-attended, presented a variety of topics and offered networking opportunities for professionals in both the public and the private sectors. The KCITE Board continues to be excited about the chapter's future and credits the success of the chapter to the hard working individuals who have made such a positive impact by forming such a strong chapter base.

The chapter boundaries were established in 2003 to include the major cities within a 70-mile radius of Kansas City. This resulted in a total of 14 counties within the chapter area – seven (7) in Kansas and seven (7) in Missouri. In addition to Kansas City, the cities of Lawrence, Topeka and St. Joseph are also included in the chapter boundaries. The inclusion of these nearby cities offers the opportunity for representatives from agencies, institutions and companies throughout the metropolitan area to be fully involved in a local connection to ITE. In addition to the local agencies, institutions and companies, the KCITE chapter also includes the University of Kansas (KU) and the University of Missouri – Kansas City (UMKC). The presence of local student ITE chapters enables the KCITE chapter to foster and assist these student chapters which has been an ongoing goal of the organization.

The first year that chapter monies were budgeted for student chapter sponsorships was in 2008. In 2009, the chapter continued this allocation of money towards the student chapter sponsorships and has found it to be a very worthwhile initiative. The student chapters that benefit from the sponsorships are the KU and UMKC student chapters. Both chapters have been actively participating in chapter meetings and in KCITE-sponsored training opportunities. The budget that is allocated to these sponsorships covers free annual membership to the chapter, free attendance to the chapter meetings and reimbursement of transportation needed to attend chapter activities. KCITE board and chapter members also support the local student chapters by attending student chapter meetings and serving as presenters at the meetings when requested.

In the past, the KCITE policy manual did not recognize the designation of lifetime member as a classification. In 2009, it was a goal of the Board of Direction to amend the policy manual and to include such a designation. During the annual elections this past November and December, the membership voted on this change to the by-laws and approved the new designation.

The Chapter continued to provide a web-based resource for members to more easily access meeting schedules and other information regarding the chapter. The website is updated on a regular basis and includes information such as meeting announcements, officers, history, technical committees, governance, past meetings and, when applicable, information on each of the candidates. The website is located at **www.kcite.org**.

In 2009, the **Excellence in Transportation Award** was awarded at the July chapter meeting. The award recognizes an organization for one or all of the following:

- Development of an innovative concept in transportation planning, design or operations;
- Innovative application of a proven concept in transportation planning, design or operations;
- Implementation of a "difficult" transportation program through perseverance in its development and promotion;
- A program or project having a significant affect on regional transportation;
- A multi-faceted transportation program or project, combining many innovative and/or well-applied concepts;
- A program or project promoting a major advance in the efficiency and/or economy of transportation.

The 2009 recipient of the annual Award was presented to the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) for the Operation Green Light Regional Signal Coordination Project. The project was a great example of an innovative program that continues to have a significant impact on regional transportation. All submittals were forwarded to MOVITE for consideration for their transportation award. The Operation Green Light project was also recognized by MOVITE.

11. Student Chapter Activities

KU and UMKC have established student chapters and have been actively participating in chapter meetings and KCITE-sponsored training opportunities. The budget that is allocated to these sponsorships covers things such as free annual membership to the chapter, free attendance to the chapter meetings and reimbursement of transportation needed to attend chapter activities.

In 2009, five (5) student affiliates registered as members of KCITE's organization. In addition, a total of 13 students attended the chapter meetings during 2009.

12. Community Awareness and Involvement Activities

The second annual KCITE food drive was held during the July chapter meeting. We collected 243 cans of food which is equivalent to 272 pounds of food for our community. The food that was collected was donated to Harvesters of Kansas City. In addition, we sponsored a contest to encourage agencies and companies to donate large amounts of food. The agency/company that donated the largest amount of food per person was the City of Overland Park, followed closely by Olsson Associates. A special thanks was extended to all of our members for making this event such a great success.

13. Technical Activities

KCITE hosts training opportunities throughout the year. Training locations vary and are dependent upon current interest within the KCITE community. KCITE uses web seminars sponsored by ITE and other professional organizations such as ASCE and FHWA to meet our annual training goal. Sponsorship of training events from public agencies and private companies is encouraged to minimize expenses and is often offered at no cost to the attendee.

The annual goal according to KCITE's Policy Manual is to provide our members with the opportunity to receive at least 15 PDHs per year through chapter meetings and sponsored training events. During 2009, a total of 23.5 PDHs were offered to KCITE members and affiliates through chapter meetings and sponsored training opportunities.

14. Awards Program

In 2004, the Chapter established an **Excellence in Transportation Award** that is presented annually to an organization(s) for an outstanding transportation project in the chapter area. The award is structured very similarly to the award sponsored by MOVITE. In 2009, the fifth recipient of the KCITE Excellence in Transportation Award was presented to the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) for the Operation Green Light Regional Signal Coordination Project.

Operation Green Light works with federal, state and local agencies to develop and implement a system that coordinates traffic signal timing plans and communication between traffic signal equipment across 20 jurisdictional boundaries in two states. The project began in March of 1999 and focuses on corridors with regional significance.



2009 Annual Chapter Report





Summary

2009 marked the fourth year of LOCATE. Highlights of the year include the continuation of the award winning Making a Difference community service project, which LOCATE embarked upon in 2008. 2009 also saw LOCATE become a title sponsor of the annual ASCE/LOCATE Transportation Conference, which is held at the Walter Scott Conference Center in Omaha.

The Chapter Boundaries were established in 2005 to include the major cities of Lincoln, Omaha, and Council Bluffs. The counties of Washington, Douglas, Dodge, Sarpy, Cass, Saunders and Lancaster in Nebraska and Mills and Pottawattamie in Iowa make up the Nebraska-Iowa area. Our chapter encourages participation by all types of professionals including traffic, roadway design, planning, transit and many others, both public and private.

Membership

Area transportation professionals continued their support of the Chapter. Attendance at chapter meetings has been outstanding with an average of over 35 professionals and 10 students in attendance at each Chapter meeting. On December 31, 2009, we had a total of 101 chapter members.

Activities

Notice of all Chapter meetings is distributed to over 120 transportation professionals within the Chapter area, including all members and affiliates. In 2009, LOCATE held seven activities including general meetings, a webinar, a transportation conference, golf outing and an annual meeting. A change was made to hold meetings in even months in 2009 rather than odd months in an effort to increase meeting attendance. They are described as follows:

- Two general meetings were held as lunch meetings. The February 25th meeting was held in Lincoln;a presentation was given on the Lincoln Beltway Project. The August 19th meeting was held in Omaha, and a presentation was given on the MAPA Beltway Study.
- In March, LOCATE facilitated a professional development activity in conjunction with the UNO and UNL student chapters of ITE. Each student chapter provided lunch and hosted the Reducing Collisions at High Crash Locations "webinar" sponsored by ITE.
 12 professionals and 2 UNO representatives participated in Omaha;11 professionals, 3 UNL representatives, and 10 students participated in Lincoln.
- On April 17th, ASCE and LOCATE held the annual joint transportation conference.
 Although LOCATE representatives had assisted in planning the conference the last few years, 2009 was the first year LOCATE served as a named sponsor. It was a day-long



event and approximately 200 transportation professionals from the area were in attendance.

- The annual golf outing was held on June 11th in Bellevue, Nebraska at Tregaron Golf Course. Approximately 30 members participated in the event, which included a buffet lunch and prize.
- LOCATE held a professional-student mixer in October with a tour of Valmont Industries in Valley, Nebraska. 14 professionals and 14 students from UNL attended the tour.
- After the 2008 annual meeting, several comments were received that a new format should be explored to increase attendance. An online survey was held and it was determined that a less formal lunch meeting should be held. The annual meeting was held on December 11th at Round the Bend Steakhouse in South Bend, Nebraska about half way between Lincoln and Omaha. The new format was successful, with 44 members in attendance.

Making a Difference Project

In addition to the above activities the Making a Difference community service project was continued in 2009. In 2007, a challenge was issued by MOVITE for all of the chapters to find a way to "make a difference" within their communities. The LOCATE Board accepted the challenge and developed a driver safety program presentation geared at local high school students.



The fully volunteer presentation program was launched with the 2008-09 school year and has continued through the 2009-10 school year. The program has been warmly received by high school teachers and administrators. As of the end of 2009, presentations have been made to 2,484 students in nine Nebraska high schools. Each of the high schools has asked that we return to make additional presentations in order to engage more of their students. LOCATE's goal is to reach 2,500 students per academic year.

LOCATE was awarded a Special Recognition Award in Nebraska's 2008 Governor's Transportation Safety Challenge. In April 2009, two LOCATE representatives attended the Nebraska Transportation Safety Conference in Kearney to receive the award. The application and award are included in the Appendix; please refer to it for further information regarding the Making a Difference project.

Leadership

Elections for our 2010 officers were held in late November and early December of 2009. This process was administered through an electronic ballot. The election utilized Elections On-Line the vendor used by ITE for international elections. This method proved to be very cost-effective and qite successful;64 members cast ballots. The voter turnout was 52 percent.

The Board of Direction met seven times in 2009 to coordinate Chapter activities. The Board made an effort to meet via conference call to save drive time and costs. For additional details, the board meeting minutes are included in the Appendix.

The LOCATE Board adopted a policy on Board representation to promote geographical representation from the three named cities in the chapter: Lincoln, Omaha, and Council Bluffs. The policy was distributed to the membership in June 2009 and is included in the Appendix.

The idea of a LOCATE website has been discussed for the last several years. In 2009, the need for a website was put to a vote of the members in the election. 65 percent of the members voted in favor of the creation of a LOCATE website. The Board will implement a website in 2010.

The LOCATE Board would like to thank MOVITE for a contribution of \$00 to send a Board member to the MOVITE Fall Meeting in Springfield, Missouri. Matt Kruse, LOCATE Treasurer attended the meeting.



Finances

The philosophy of the Board for Chapter meeting expenses to be fully supported by meeting income remains the same and has proven to be effective in 2009. The Chapter ended 2009 with an account balance of \$,501.86.

Annual dues were used to support the other operations of the Chapter, such as providing free meeting attendance (including meals) for students. The funds raised at the golf outing were used to provide entertainment for the annual meeting.

Chapter finances were tracked and reported at each meeting. The final 2009 Treasurer's Report, listing total expenses, revenues and reserves, is included in the Appendix.

The 2010 Budget was developed based on past history and anticipated future expenses and income. The 2010 Budget will be approved by the Board of Direction in early 2010 and is included in the Appendix.





Policy 3 – Board Representation

This policy covers how LOCATE will maintain balanced geographic representation on the Executive Board.

It is desirable to maintain representation on the LOCATE Board from each of the three Chapter communities (Lincoln, Omaha and Council Bluffs). Therefore, first priority will be given to nominating qalifi ed candidates from the community that will not have representation. However, it is recognized that it may not be possible to find qalified and willing candidates for every election. In the case where only one qalified candidate is av ailable from the community not represented on the LOCATE Board, that candidate will run unopposed. If candidates are not available from the community that is not represented on the LOCATE Board and candidates from any community can be nominated subject to the applicable quidelines.
