For most Sections it is likely more typical for meetings to take place on a monthly or bi-monthly bases. Given MOVITE"s large geographic area we historically have held two general meetings and three board meetings per year. However, this is only a small part of the activities that are taking place in our Section. Through our six chapters, a total of 60 chapter meetings, webinars, technical sessions, and social gatherings took place in 2011. MOVITE is very proud of our chapter activities and the opportunities this has provided to the Section.

CHAPTER ACTIVITIES

Since the MOVITE section covers a large geographic area, there are several chapters that have the ability to meet more frequently and provide MOVITE members with further opportunities for technical presentations, continuing education, and networking. There are currently six MOVITE chapters:

STUDENT CHAPTERS

Student participation at MOVITE activities continues to proved positive connections between MOVITE members and the student chapters within the MOVITE area. Students participated in both the Spring and Fall meetings. Students were challenged with a poster competition during the spring meeting in Dubuque. Students from various chapters submitted posters that were reviewed and judged by MOVITE and MWITE members during the conference with the winning posters receiving cash prizes for their efforts. New student chapter at Saint Louis University – in 2009 Saint Louis University added Civil Engineering to its undergraduate degree program. Dr. Yao-Jan Wu joined the civil engineering department in August 2011 as an assistant professor of transportation engineering. Since joing the faculty, he is promoting ITE in many classes and student activities. Five undergraduate students and one graduate student have initiated the process to charter a new ITE student chapter in the spring of 2012.

SUMMARY OF MOVITE SECTION ACTIVITIES

MOVITE began the 2011 year in December of 2010 with an officers retreat. The retreat gave us the opportunity to review the role of each board member and discuss our goals for the upcoming year. We had several new board members: Jason Haynes, Board Director from Missouri; Michael Wahlstedt, Missouri State Director; Mark Lutjeharms, Nebraska State Director; Andy Swisher, Iowa State Director. Martin Gugel continues to be our Journal Editor, and Gnani Mahalingam stayed on as our Web Page Administrator.

MOVITE holds two regular meetings each year. The meetings are typically held in the spring and the fall of each year, and are rotated throughout the MOVITE six-state area. At each of the meetings a board meeting and a business meeting are held.

In 2011, MOVITE celebrated its 60th Anniversary. The charter was granted on April 6, 1951 by the Institute of Traffic Engineers. Since then our section grew from five states to six states and from eight charter members to approximately 627 members, affiliate members, and student members.

MOVITE was the host section for the ITE Annual meeting in St. Louis, Missouri, August 13 through 16. TEAM assisted with the planning and conducting the ITE Annual Meeting. Two TEAM Board members, Jennifer Dugan (Treasurer) and Carrie Falkenrath (Past President), were on the Planning Committee. They also assisted at the meeting itself, along with other TEAM and MOVITE members who volunteered to help.

SPRING MEETING



The Joint Spring MOVITE/ITE Midwestern District Meeting was held in Dubuque, Iowa, June 26 to 28. The theme of the meeting was "Learning for our History to Guide Our Future". The meeting also included special events to celebrate MOVITE"s 60th Anniversary. Out of the 43 living past presidents, ten attended the meeting.

During breakfast, Earl Newman (past president in 1984 and past ITE president in 2007) presented a slide show with photos and biographies of some of our past presidents, as well as section history. The attending past presidents also shared their memories of MOVITE and what it meant to serve on the board

The final day of the meeting included Dr. Dan Turner, from SDITE. He discussed Leadership in our profession.

The other meeting highlights included bus rapid transit along Cedar Avenue in the Minneapolis metro area; crash history of run of the road crashes and countermeasures; microsimulation of downtown Milwaukee street car study; high capacity transit in Overland Park, KS, using Bluetooth to capture data, mini-RWIS (roadway weather information system) in Overland Park, KS using lasers to detect surface conditions; Texas DOT freight resiliency study; and a research update from Center for Transportation Research (Iowa State University) including a study on the relationship between pavement marking retroreflectivity and safety, and SHRP 2-04A (a cooperative study with Virginia Transportation Institute) to study driver behavior.

With 52 students attending the meeting, special emphasis was given to students. Each session of the meeting had one presentation by a student. Also, a poster contest was held. Of course, the third annual traffic bowl was a draw for the students. Eleven teams participated this year. The University of Kansas represented MOVITE and MWITE at the ITE International Meeting in St. Louis, Missouri

FALL MEETING

The Annual Meeting was held in Little Rock, Arkansas, September 14 to 16. The theme of the meeting was Rock ,n" Roll Highway 67. The highway designation pays tribute to the musical heritage of Arkansas.

On Wednesday, a full-day accessible pedestrian signals workshop was help. Approximately 40 people attended the session, which discussed the issues for pedestrians. the equipment and the placement of the signals at intersections. Janet Barlow, from Accessible Design for the Blind in Ashville, North Carolina, and Daniel Carter, from the Highway Safety Research Center at the University of North Carolina, were the presenters at the workshop.

During the Thursday conference, Janet Barlow discussed maintaining accessible pedestrian facilities during construction and maintenance projects. The MUTCD contains the guidance for the paths (i.e., alternate path must have similar characteristics as existing path, must be continuous and unobstructed, and free of protruding objects, etc.). She had photos of portable ramps and barriers that can be used. She also had an example of a device that provides an audible message for sidewalk closures.



Daniel Carter gave a presentation on low-cost safety improvements. It was a summary of the NCHRP Report 500 series. The results were mixed. For example, flashing beacons on stop signs had a 4% to 13% reduction in angle, 1% to 10% reduction in injury and fatality crashes. Mark Johnson, MTJ Engineering, gave a presentation on roundabouts. He reported that roundabouts could be spaced very close, without driver confusion. One of the locations that he cited was the US-23 and Lee Road interchange in Brighton, Michigan. There's approximately 185ft between two multi-lane roundabouts.

Rock Miller, ITE President, presented bicycling accommodation in Long Beach, California. City staff traveled to Salt Lake City to see how they encouraged cycling. In shared lanes, Salt Lake City installed green pavement. Long Beach did, too. Long Beach also created bicycle boulevards – low speed, low vehicular volume roadways. To maintain the boulevards, traffic calming devices were installed and some intersections restricted to vehicular traffic. Overall, Long Beach increased bicycle ridership by 25%.

On Friday, the conference ended with a session on professional ethics. The overall message is to keep in mind that we deal with public safety. That puts engineers in a special class. We should always look to do the right thing.

Every annual meeting includes the past presidents" breakfast. This is a time when we honor our past presidents for their contributions and dedication to our section.

We are seeing the continued strengthening of the membership through our Chapters because it helps ITE become more personal and relevant at the local level. MOVITE is very excited about the Chapters and all the activities they conduct. We are hoping to establish a chapter in Iowa next year.

A few highlights of Chapter activities:

TEAM Fair: Teams's biggest event of the year is the annual TEAM fair. At the ninth annual TEAM fair, 279 participants including 12 university students and 31 high school students. This year's Fair was held September 29. Attendees had the opportunity to obtain 6.5 PDHs for the low registration fee of \$30 for members and \$40 for non-members. Together with TEAM, the 2011 Fair was hosted by: the City of Maryland Heights, the Missouri Department of Transportation, Saint Louis County Highways and Traffic, MOVITE.

<u>Technically Busy</u>: KCITE meets consistently throughout the year and one of their established goals is to provide a venue to economically provide continuing education. While their identified goal is to provide 15 PDHs, KCITE provided opportunities for gaining more than 32 PDH units for members and affiliates through chapter meetings and sponsored training.

<u>Community Service</u>: Several of the chapters participate in community activities. KCITE has an annual food drive for a local pantry. TEAM joined with the Marines" Toys for Tots program. OCITE help a fundraiser after the Joplin tornado.

<u>Student Connections</u>: Several MOVITE chapters are working to reinvigorate student chapters. LOCATE is working with the University of Nebraska – Lincoln. TEAM is working with Washington University.

In addition to a potential new student chapter at St. Louis University, KCITE continues to encourage the students at the University of Missouri – Kansas City, with the hope of starting a new student chapter.

At the middle school level, KCITE members participate in future cities. In 2011, KCITE initiated a transportation award for the future cities team with the most innovative transportation system.

Adding it all up: While MOVITE only meets two times each year for meetings, the MOVITE Chapters met a total of 60 times, including webinars, technical sessions, and social gatherings.



APPENDIX D - 60TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

2011 is a special year for MOVITE. It is our 60th Anniversary. The charter was granted on April 6, 1951 by the Institute of Traffic Engineers at the Muehlebach Hotel in Kansas City, Missouri. There were eight charter members. The Section consisted of five states: Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Oklahoma. There were eight Charter Members. One of these members, Reyburn Hoffman of St. Louis, Missouri, was also a founding member of ITE at the first meeting of the Institute, October 2, 1930.

Thomas J. Seburn of Kansas City, Missouri (Past President of ITE, 1947 to 1949) was elected as first President of MOVITE.

Over the years, the section grew to six states (Arkansas was added in 1961) and our membership grew.

Out of the 43 living past presidents, ten attended the meeting in Dubuque. They were: Earl Newman (1984), Paul Bertrand (1988), Thomas Swenson (1996), Kenneth B. Morris (1999), Neal Hawkins (2001), Jay Wynn (2003), Nicci Tiner (2005), Linda Voss (2006), Doug Ripley (2007), and Angelo Lombardo (2010). The following pages contain information about our charter members and past presidents.

Interesting Facts About

MOVITE Charter Members and Past Presidents

- 1. **Burt Whedon** of Omaha, Nebraska, passed away on April 27, 2011. Burt was the last living Charter Member of MOVITE.
- 2. **Reyburn Hoffman** of St. Louis, Missouri, was a Charter Member of MOVITE and also a founding member of ITE having attended the first meeting of the Institute held on October 2, 1930.
- 3. Four of the eight MOVITE Charter members became president of the Section. They are **Thomas J. Seburn** (1951-52), **George J. Fisher** (1952-53), **Leon W. Corder** (1953-54), and **Joseph J. Feuchter** (1954-55, 1955-56).
- Seventeen past presidents are deceased. They are Thomas J. Seburn (August, 24, 1989), George J. Fisher (July, 1964), Leon W. Corder (July 15, 1961), Joseph J. Feuchter (April, 1965), A. J. "Tony" Basile (November 25, 1980), Ellis C. Henry, Jr. (December 18, 1970), George C. Lichty (February 28, 1964), O. J. (Jack) Falin (May 25, 1993), Johannes S. (Jan) Kibbe (June 24, 1996), Patrick T. McCoy (October 28, 2002), Jack A. Hutter (January 4, 2004), Thomas J. Dalton, Jr. (August 4, 2005), Jimmy J. Dawaliby (October 20, 2005), William J. Armstrong (January 6, 2008), Melvin B. Meyer (June 4, 2008), Daniel J. Hanson (August 8, 2009), and Robert L. Meyer (May 7, 2010)
- 5. **Herman M. Batts,** based on his age (87 on April 12) and his term in office, is the oldest living past president having served as the 12th president of MOVITE in 1964.
- 6. Four past presidents have been President of ITE. They are: **Thomas J. Seburn** of Kansas City, Missouri (9th president of ITE in 1947-49, past president of MOVITE in 1951-52); **Melvin B. Meyer** of Cedar Rapids, Iowa (45th president of ITE in1984, past president of MOVITE in 1976); **Steven D. Hofener** of Oklahoma City (65th president of ITE in 2004, past president of MOVITE in 1991); and **Earl E. Newman** of Springfield, Missouri(48th president of ITE in 2007, past president of MOVITE in 1984). Tom actually served as president of ITE before becoming the first president of MOVITE in 1951. Mel served six years on the ITE Board of Direction from 1980 to 1982 as Chairman of the ITE Technical Council (now Coordinating Council), and as an officer from 1983 to 1985. Steve is completing a three year term as Chair of the Transportation Professional Certification Board, Inc. Earl served a total of six years on the ITE Board of Direction from 2001 to 2003 as International Director representing the Midwestern District and as an officer from 2006 to 2008.
- 7. **George J. Fisher** served as the first Director for Midwestern District (1956-57). In addition, the following Past Presidents went on to serve terms on the ITE Executive Board as Director of District 4: **Joseph J. Feuchter** (1962-63), **Herman M. Batts** (1968-69), **Garry W. Metcalf** (1989-91), and **Earl E. Newman** (2001-03).
- 8. Past presidents that went on to serve as Chair of the Midwestern District were **Delbert Karmeier** (1968), **David Snider** (1972), **Gerald Brickell** (1976), **James A. Thompson** (IA) (1980), **Jan Kibbe** (1983), **Darold Davis** (1987), **Carol Estes** (1991), **Gary Fox** (1995), **William Henry** (1999), **Michael Gorman** (2003), **Kyle Anderson** (2007) and **Doug Ripley** (2011). Kyle and Doug have served the District as President having been elected to their positions after the reorganization of the District governance in 2003. Michael presided over the District when members voted approval to change the By-Laws to have elected officers that serve four-year terms rotating through all of the offices.

- 9. There have been six non-professional engineers to serve as President of MOVITE. They are O. J. (Jack) Falin (1965), Jimmy J. Dawaliby (1969-70), John G. Rothrock (1978), Johannes S. (Jan) Kibbe (1982), Greg B. Simmons (1993) and Doug Ripley (2007).
- 10. Multiple past presidents had the same last name and two past presidents had the same name. They are Robert L. Meyer (1956-57) and Melvin B. Meyer (1976); Ellis C. Henry, Jr. (1959-60) and William L. Henry (1998); James A. Thompson (FHWA, Kansas City, Missouri, 1972-73) and James A. Thompson (City of Des Moines, Iowa, past president 1979). None of these gentlemen were related to each other.
- 11. However, two past presidents are related. **Harold R. Hofener** (1973) is the father of **Steven D. Hofener** (1991).
- 12. MOVITE adopted the tradition of holding the Annual Fall Meeting in the president's hometown (or their place of choice) with the 1978 meeting in Topeka, Kansas, following similar format used in 1974 (St. Louis) and 1976 (Cedar Rapids). All meetings since 1978 have followed this tradition except that **Shawn J. Leight** (2009), from St. Louis, Missouri, decided to hold the fall 2009 Annual Meeting in Springfield, Missouri. St. Louis was the site of the 2007 joint ITE Midwestern District/MOVITE meeting and the 2011 ITE International Annual meeting.
- 13. **Joseph J. Feuchter** (president in 1954-55 and 1955-56) was the only person to serve two terms as President of MOVITE.
- 14. **Keith W. Graham** (president in 1965) was the only president that did not complete his full term in office. Keith resigned mid-year to accept a job out of the section area. **O. J. Falin** moved up to president to complete the 1965 term in office.
- 15. **Daniel J. Hanson** (past president 1963) was the first president to be elected by vote of the entire membership. Prior to his election, officers were elected by the Board of Direction.
- 16. Carol S. Estes (president 1990) was the first woman to serve as president subsequently followed by Nicci D. Tiner (2005) and Linda G. Voss (2006).
- 17. **Linda G. Voss** (2006) took 17 years between her first year on the Board in 1989 as a 2 year director to becoming president in 2006. Linda served on the Board from 1989-1993 when she completed her year as Vice-President. Linda then resigned short of becoming President, realizing that she probably would not get another opportunity to serve as MOVITE President. However, in 2005, Steven R. Schooley, also from Kansas, decided to end his run on the Board at the end of his Vice-Presidential year, providing the opportunity for Linda to return to the Board to complete the offices of President (2006) and Immediate Past President (2007).
- 18. **Doug A. Ripley** (2007) is the only Past President to be employed by an equipment supplier. Twenty-seven of the presidents worked for city government; seven worked for state highway departments; three worked for county government; one worked for the federal government; two were university professors; and 21 worked for consultants. Seven out of the last ten presidents have been consultants.
- 19. There have been five presidents from Arkansas; six presidents from Oklahoma; eight presidents from Nebraska; nine presidents from Iowa; 13 presidents from Kansas; and 21 presidents from Missouri. **Thomas J. Seburn** was the first president from Missouri in 1951-52. **George J. Fisher** was the first MOVITE president from Kansas in 1952-53. **Robert L. Meyer** was the first MOVITE president from Nebraska in 1956-57. **Herman M. Batts** was the first MOVITE president from Oklahoma in 1973. **Robert T. Alguire** was the first MOVITE president from Arkansas in 1987.

- 20. There have been four presidents each from the City of Des Moines, City of Topeka, and JBM Consulting Engineers. There have been three presidents each from the City of Kansas City, City of Springfield, St. Louis County, City of Wichita, and the Missouri Highway Department.
- 21. Of the 43 living past presidents, 39 continue to reside in the MOVITE area.
- 22. Ten past presidents served as editor of the MOVITE Journal prior to serving as president: **Keith W. Graham** (1959-61), **Del Karmeier** (1963-64), **Jim Dawaliby** (1966-67), **Gerry Brickell** (1971-72), **Ed Mulcahy** (1972-73), **Jim Thompson** (Iowa) (1973-74), **Bill McKinley** (1975-76), **Jan Kibbe** (1977-78), **David Woosley** (1979), and **Neal Hawkins** (1994).
- 23. Two past presidents served as Chairman of the ITE Urban Traffic Engineers Council (now Traffic Engineering Council): **Mel Meyer** (1986-1989) and **David Woosley** (1991-1992). David continues to serve on the Executive Board of the Traffic Engineering Council.
- 24. Jack Hutter (1957-58) also served as President of the Illinois Section in 1972.
- 25. Seven of our Past Presidents have an October birthday and four Past Presidents have birthdays in the months of January, February, June, August, and September. Herman M. Batts is our oldest Past President at 87 and our youngest past president is Doug Ripley at 39.
- 26. **Keith W. Graham** (1965), **Robert G. Holsinger** (1968) and **David G. Snider** (1971) were our youngest presidents, all being 32 years of age in the year they served as president. **Robert T. Alguire** (1987) was our oldest president at 50 years of age. The most frequent age for our presidents is 39 years of age with 40 years of age being the median age.
- 27. **Keith W. Graham** (1965) was the first person born in the 1930's to be elected MOVITE President. Keith was 31 years of age when elected. William A. McKinley (1980) was the first person born in the 1940's to be elected MOVITE President. Bill was 36 years of age. **James V. Dickinson** (1989) was the first person born in the 1950's to be elected MOVITE President. Jim was 37 years of age. **Bruce L. Wacker** (2000) was the first person born in the 1960's to be elected MOVITE President. Bruce was 36 years of age. **Douglas A. Ripley** (2007) was the first person born in the 1970's to be elected MOVITE President. Doug was 36 years of age. James V. Dickinson is the only past president to be born in 1951, the year of the charter.
- 28. The following Presidents served as first City Traffic Engineer of at least one city:

29. The Bureau of Highway Traffic Program had a great influence on the careers of many early traffic engineers all across the country. Ten MOVITE Past Presidents attended the Bureau of Highway Traffic (all at Yale University, except as noted). There were numerous other MOVITE members that also attended the Bureau program.

- 30. A total of 22 past presidents have Master's Degrees, 17 of which are in the last 30 years. **Robert T. Alguire** (1986) and Patrick T. McCoy (1992) also had Doctorate Degrees.
- 31. Eleven Presidents have PTOE Certifications, two (2) Presidents have PTP Certifications, and one President has an AICP Certification.
- 32. There were 27 past presidents born before the MOVITE Charter was issued and 33 past presidents born after the charter was issued.





1 Chapter Organization

The Transportation Student Association (TSA) serves as the parent organization for the student chapter of the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) at Iowa State University (ISU). Since TSA's beginning in

1997, ITE has been the foundation upon which the organization is built. All members of TSA are encouraged to become student members of ITE. The majority of the business and activities carried out by TSA revolves around its affiliation with ITE. TSA holds business meetings at least once a month to discuss current transportation issues, as well as ITE events.



The organization has been very active in 2010-2011 and continues to provide students interested in transportation with varied professional activities and opportunities. TSA has given its members the chance to experience the transportation field through networking with professionals, and undertaking service projects within the community. The following sections detail the ISU chapter's history, organization, activities, budget, and student membership.

1.1 History of TSA

Prior to June 1997, Iowa State University students did not have a student chapter of ITE. Most students interested in transportation believed that an ITE chapter would interfere with the existing American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) student chapter. However, ISU did have a group called the Transportation Society (TranSoc) that was composed of graduate students with majors that included Civil Engineering, Community and Regional Planning, Transportation Logistics, and Economics. The organization was loosely formed and conducted monthly meetings at which members presented their research projects.

Attendance at TranSoc meetings dwindled to just a handful of members, so in June 1997 it was decided that the group needed a legitimate and professional affiliation to provide:

- 1) Professional membership and career opportunities for members, and
- 2) A means by which to promote the growing, inter-departmental transportation programs at Iowa State.

The idea was conceived to form a transportation organization that included ITE membership. That organization is now the Transportation Student Association.

1.2 Organizational Structure

The student leadership of TSA consists of a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Social Chair, Engineering Student Council (ESC) Representative and Recruitment Chair. One of the driving forces behind TSA's continued success has been the strong leadership and enthusiasm of its cabinet. Officers are elected at the end of the spring semester to serve for the following fall and spring. Details about the current TSA officers are listed below.



1.2.1- President - Teng "Alex" Wang

Alex Wang has been an active member of TSA since his senior year at Iowa State in 2008. Alex has previously held the TSA position of recruitment chair and became the TSA president in Fall 2010. As a graduate student, he works at the Institute for Transportation under the guidance of Dr. Gkritza and Dr. Souleyrette. Alex's research focuses on applications of geographic information systems to transportation, highway safety, relationship between road features and safety, transportation planning models and statistical assessment of safety issues.

1.2.2- Vice-President - Steve Lavrenz



Steve Lavrenz has been an active member of TSA since his freshman year at Iowa State, 2006. Steve has previously held the TSA position of secretary, and works actively with the President to facilitate speaker meetings and other club event opportunities. Steve also currently serves as President of the Iowa State chapter of the Chi Epsilon Civil Engineering Honor Society. Now a graduate student, he works at the Institute for Transportation under the guidance of Dr. Gkritza. Steve's research focus has been on interaction between transportation and power systems, as well as winter weather safety, and his thesis is an economic analysis of automated electric highway technology.



1.2.3- Treasurer - Huishan Duan

Huishan Duan graduated in May 2009 with her B.S. degree in Civil Engineering at Iowa State University. She is currently a master's student in Civil Engineering with an emphasis of Transportation Engineering. Huishan previously held the position of TSA recruitment chair in 2009. She currently serves as the treasurer for TSA and her major professor is Dr. Shauna Hallmark. Currently, her thesis topic is Effectiveness of Reflectorized Strips on Vehicle Speed and Lateral Placement during Day and Night on U.S. 52, and her research mainly focuses on low-cost strategies to reduce speed and crashes on curves.



1.2.4 - Secretary (2010) - Josh Singsank

Josh Singsank has been an active member of TSA since the fall of 2008. Josh was the secretary of TSA for over 1 year, taking minutes and pictures at all TSA events. He also created and updated the current TSA website while serving in the secretary position. Josh worked at the Institute for Transportation, under Zach Hans, identifying and analyzing horizontal curves in the state of Iowa. Josh recently changed his major to construction engineering at Iowa State and is running for a position on the Associated General Contractors Student Chapter.



1.2.5- Secretary (2011) - Mitchell Holtzman

Mitchell Holtzman has been an active member of TSA since August 2010. Mitchell became the secretary for the spring semester of 2011, taking notes and attendance at all meetings. He is responsible for keeping the TSA website up to date with meeting times, and pictures and notes from past events and speakers. Mitchell is also an active member in the American Society of Civil Engineers as well as the Chi Epsilon Engineering Honor Society. Mitchell is currently on a co-op through the lowa Department of Transportation and is set to graduate in Fall 2012.



1.2.6- Social Chairs - Nicole Oneyear and Bo Wang

Nicole Oneyear has been active in TSA since fall of 2009. Nicole was the president in spring of 2010 and has been a social co-chair for the last year helping to plan events such as a bingo night and ice skating. She is also a member of the Civil Engineering Graduate Student Council and Chi Epsilon. She is currently a master's student in Civil Engineering working with Dr. Shauna Hallmark on research related to evaluating automated enforcement in Cedar Rapids, IA and is set to graduate in summer 2011.



Bo Wang has been an active member of TSA since his senior year at Iowa State in 2009. Bo has previously held the ESC Representative position in 2009 and also the social co-chair in Fall 2010. Bo is a graduate student in transportation engineering and under the guidance of Dr. Shauna Hallmark. His research area focuses on the evaluation of energy, emission, and economical analysis on hybrid bus system.



1.2.7- ESC Representative (2010) - Evan Vencil

Evan Vencil has been an active member of TSA for several years, and in addition to the ESC Representative position, has held the title of Vice President. Evan is a graduate student in transportation engineering under the guidance of Dr. Hallmark. His research area focuses on transportation safety, particularly with respect to the Safety Edge should design technology currently being implemented on rural roads.



1.2.8- ESC Representative (2011) - Eirini Kastrouni

Eirini joined the graduate program at Iowa State University in Fall 2010 and has been active as the ESC Representative for TSA. She is currently working under the guidance of Dr. Gkritza on a research project that addresses a Grand National challenge: how to design a national system integrating energy and transportation infrastructures while accounting for interdependencies between them, new energy supply technologies, sustainability, and resiliency. Her broader research interests include transportation planning, sustainability, travel behavior, and transport economics. Currently, Eirini pursues a thesis on predicting passenger trips for future energy and transportation infrastructure

investment planning using the National Household Travel Survey (NHTS) data.



1.2.9- Recruitment Chair - Christa Van'T Hul

Christa Van't Hul has been involved in TSA since the Spring semester of 2010, which was her second semester at Iowa State. She has held the position of recruitment chair since the begining of her sophomore year. Christa works with other members of the cabinet to hang up flyers announcing TSA meetings, and talk to a few classes about TSA. She is currently an undergrad student with interests of bridge and road design.



1.2.8- Faculty Advisor - Reg Souleyrette

Dr. Reginald Souleyrette is a Professor of Civil Engineering in the Department of Civil, Construction and Environmental Engineering at ISU. He conducts and manages research on the application of geographic information systems to transportation (GIS-T), remote sensing and monitoring, traffic safety, and transportation planning and modeling. Dr. Souleyrette currently serves as the faculty advisor for TSA.



1.2.9- Faculty Advisor - Konstantina "Nadia" Gkritza

Dr. Nadia Gkritza joined the faculty in 2007 as an Assistant Professor of Civil Engineering in the Department of Civil, Construction, and Environmental Engineering at ISU. Her interests and research experience lie in a variety of transportation related problems, including transportation planning, transportation economics and econometrics, and highway safety. Dr. Gkritza currently serves as the Iowa State ITE Student Chapter advisor.

2 ISU-ITE Student Chapter Membership

The primary objective of the Transportation Student Association is to promote the transportation profession among undergraduate and graduate students in a multidisciplinary forum. At ISU, the membership of TSA stretches across three University colleges: Engineering, Design, and Business, and currently has 25 student members. TSA attempts to diversify its

membership by keeping a healthy balance between engineering, planning, and transportation logistics students at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

In the past, a majority of TSA's members have been graduate students. Since the creation of the position in the fall of 2004, the Recruitment Chair has attempted to increase the number of freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors involved in the organization. The Recruitment Chair would be responsible for contacting professors in the Civil Engineering, Community and Regional Planning and Transportation Logistics Departments and informing students about TSA during the semester.

2.1 ISU-ITE Student Chapter Recruitment and Outreach

TSA participated in a number of recruitment and outreach activities at ISU this past year. These events included in-class recruitment, a fall kickoff tailgate with students and faculty, a booth at the Department of Civil Engineering kick-off picnic and a fall student/faculty social. Some of the benefits that TSA highlights include the diversity of the group (both by major and degree), exposure to potential employers, a broader knowledge of transportation, community services, informal interaction with professors and other students, and partial funding to attend conferences.

2.1.1 In-Class Recruitment

Recruiting within the undergraduate and graduate courses at ISU and support from the professors has been a benefit to the organization. In addition to posting meeting announcements in the buildings and e-mailing the current members, the Recruitment Chair attended classes to announce meetings and share benefits about the organization. TSA has recruited from several classes in the following university departments.

- 1) Department of Civil, Construction and Environmental Engineering College of Engineering
- 2) Department of Community and Regional Planning College of Design
- 3) Transportation Logistics College of Business

2.1.2 Department of Civil Engineering Fall Picnic



The Civil Engineering Department held a fall picnic in September 2010 to welcome students back to campus. All student organizations were invited to have a booth at the picnic and share information with the students. TSA set up a booth and spoke with numerous students about our activities.

3 ISU Transportation Program Enrollment




Figure 1 – CE Graduate Student Enrollment, 2005-2009




Figure 2 – CE Undergraduate Student Enrollment, 2005-2009

Iowa State University's Department of Civil, Construction and Environmental Engineering is home to a strong Transportation Engineering program. The enrollment data for the civil engineering program for 2005-2009 are shown below in Figures 1 & 2, as well as Table 1 for 2010. Courses offered cover the topics of highway design, traffic engineering, safety, asset management, planning and policy. In addition, Iowa State's Institute for Transportation (InTrans) offers undergraduate and graduate students the opportunity to obtain project-related research experience.

4 Chapter Activities

TSA continues to support interaction among members and transportation professionals. Student chapter meetings are held every 2-4 weeks during the academic year. In addition to these meetings, TSA also provided members with career development opportunities, both on campus and within the community. The following sections include brief descriptions of the various activities that TSA has conducted in the past academic year.

4.1 Student Chapter Meetings

Student chapter meetings include a speaker from the transportation field as well as a business meeting. A variety of transportation professionals have discussed their current projects, findings and challenging aspects of their work. Summaries of the presentations are discussed below.

September 20th, 2010 Dan Ormand & Jason Lastovica Kimley-Horn and Associates

Mr. Dan Ormand and Mr. Jason Lastovica gave a presentation of the design of urban freeways with toll operations. They started the meeting by discussing some of the currently-available transportation funding options, such as taxes and tolls.

They also talked about the current Dallas North Tollway project, and the scope of the design and construction work that was involved, specifically with regards to the Traffic Impact Analysis and the use of ITS for tolling operations.



October 4th, 2010 Dr. Reg Souleyrette Iowa State University

Dr. Souleyrette gave a presentation on the different types of travel that one might encounter overseas, especially high speed rail. Dr. Souleyrette had recently returned from a trip to East Asia, and visited countries such as China and Taiwan. He interacted extensively with the high speed rail systems (and the officials in charge of them) in those countries, in preparation for the development of a railroad engineering program at Iowa State. Dr. Souleyrette also talked about some of the traffic safety concerns faced in other countries, particularly India, as well as the safety culture success that has been enjoyed in European nations.



October 18th, 2010 Clinton Webster Snyder & Associates



Mr. Clinton Webster from Snyder & Associates gave a presentation on the oftoverlooked field of airport engineering. He first talked about the design process for an airport, including the Airport Layout Plan (ALP) and Construction Plan, and some of the factors that go into those efforts.

Mr. Webster also talked about the construction process for a modern airport, along with some of the necessary specifications, and how the margins for error are so much smaller than for roadway projects. He finished by talking about some of the regulatory components and agencies to airport design, and how those can influence

the design and construction process.

November 15th, 2010 Doug Ripley Traffic Control Corporation

Mr. Doug Ripley gave a presentation on traffic control and technology used in traffic operations. He talked about both the current levels of technology being used, as well as some of the future technologies that look promising in terms of congestion and delay reduction potential. As an ITE Midwestern District board member, Mr. Ripley also spent some time discussing the opportunities within ITE, both in regards to leadership and professional development.

November 29th, 2010 John Adam Iowa DOT, Highway Division

Mr. John Adam gave a presentation of the current transportation challenges in Iowa, and as the newly appointed director of the Iowa DOT's Highway Division, his vision for that agency as well.

Mr. Adam began by discussing some of the sheer volumes that the lowa DOT works with, such as land ownership, lane miles of highway to maintain, and number of employees. He also talked about challenges like aging infrastructure, growing traffic volumes, and extreme weather events that tax the system.

Finally, Mr. Adam talked about his vision to promote preventative maintenance on lowa infrastructure rather than total reconstruction, and how he intends to foster



employee development within all levels of his division.

January 31st, 2011 Ms. Laura Huizinga Barrier Systems, Inc.



Ms. Laura Huizinga from Barrier Systems presented at the first TSA meeting of 2011. The focus of the presentation was dynamic highway systems – that is, dynamic modification of highway lane configuration to increase capacity. Ms. Huizinga talked extensively about her company's moveable barrier system, as well as some of the other heavy duty barrier technologies that they are working on.

Ms. Huizinga also did an excellent job of communicating the more general goals of her company to reduce crash severity, and concluded with a discussion about the future of highway capacity and technology.

February 28th, 2011 Mike Dreznes Barrier Systems, Inc.

Although Mr. Mike Dreznes comes from the same company as Ms. Huizinga, his presentation focused on an entirely different aspect of traffic engineering — forgiving highways. Mr. Dreznes focused on the harsh realities of highway crashes and fatalities, and about the three different systems — the driver, the car, and the road — which interact to cause (or prevent) these crashes.

Mr. Dreznes also talked about the International Road Assessment Program (iRAP) and how it can be used to systematically improve different areas of the roadway, order to prevent crashes, and to reduce the severity of those which do occur.

April 18th, 2011: Jerry Roche, FHWA Jerry Roche

Federal Highway Administration

Mr. Jerry Roche will give the final presentation of the semester on April 18th about highway funding issues and some of the current federal highway safety programs that are being implemented across the state and nation.

4.2 Career Development

This past year, TSA continued to assist its members in the area of career development. In addition to the professionals who spoke at the general meetings, members were able to learn about graduate education opportunities. TSA made student information available to prospective employers by posting resumes on its website:

http://www.stuorg.iastate.edu/transa/homepage.html . Contacts made through the ISU career fair (where many companies send alumni who were once members of TSA) and previous TSA speaking events have assisted in many students' job searches. TSA students are accepting jobs in Arizona, Missouri, Texas, and Iowa, as well as applying for further graduate education at Iowa State and elsewhere.

4.3 ITE Midwestern District Annual Meeting

TSA provides funding for students interested in attending Midwest ITE conferences. Typically TSA sends at least 3 or 4 members to each conference. Last June, three members attended the Midwest ITE Annual Conference held in Minneapolis, Minnesota. At this conference, TSA also participated in the 2nd Annual Student Traffic Bowl, a Jeopardy-style quiz bowl with traffic and transportation engineering-related questions. The students enjoyed the conferences and the opportunity to network with many of the professionals. TSA is planning to send members to the upcoming annual conference held in Dubuque, lowa, this June.

4.4 Transportation Research Board Annual Meeting

On January 24, 2011, TSA sent 9 students to the Transportation Research Board (TRB) Annual Meeting in Washington, D.C. In total, more than 11,000 professionals from around the world attended the conference. The students were able to listen to a variety of presentations, interact with transportation professionals, and even spend some time touring the city. The students came home four days later, but not before learning a great deal about transportation topics and making some valuable contacts.

4.4.1 TRB Iowa Reception

The TRB Iowa Reception was held on Tuesday, January 25th in Washington D.C. The event was sponsored by Iowa State University and the Iowa DOT, and served as a welcome event/social mixer for transportation professionals from across the country and world. Students had a chance to interact with numerous DOT officials and other transportation research employees. It served as a great networking opportunity, as well as good publicity for the transportation program at Iowa State.



4.4.2 ITE Student Reception



On Monday, January 24th, students from Iowa State visited the ITE world headquarters in Washington, D.C.. This event also served as a social mixer for students from numerous universities who are involved with ITE. In addition to networking with peers, students were able to meet members of the International Board of Directors, including Robert Wunderlich and Paul Eng-Wong. Both individuals gave short talks to the students about becoming a transportation engineer, and how to increase your career opportunities by meeting new people and improving communication skills such as writing.

5 Promotion of Transportation

5.1 Engineering Day at the Mall

TSA members will participate in Engineering Day at the local mall with several other engineering organizations on April 9th, 2011. The event gave TSA members the opportunity to discuss the transportation field with the public while displaying projects and activities of the organization.

5.2 Ames Middle School Day



On October 18th, 2010, TSA participated in the Ames Middle School Day, sponsored by the Engineering Student Council. TSA members met with Ames Middle School students and their parents in the Memorial Union on campus, and gave demonstrations of some of the current transportation projects that are being worked on, as well as a general overview of transportation and some hands-on activities.

5.3 VEISHEA Campus Showcase

TSA will participate in this year's VEISHEA Campus Showcase event on Friday, April 15th. VEISHEA is a weeklong student-run celebration at Iowa State, and the Campus Showcase event is intended to showcase the various student groups that make up each college in the university. TSA will have a display with hands-on activities, as well as the newly-acquired driving simulator for students to see and try out.

5.4 Partnership with Go! Magazine

For the first time, this year TSA is partnering with Go! Magazine to promote transportation to students and the public. Go! Magazine is an lowa State-based transportation magazine that targets teens and young adults in order to educate them on various transportation issues and technologies. TSA worked with Go! at the Ames Middle School Day, and will continue this partnership for the Engineering Day at the Mall event, as well as the VEISHEA Campus Showcase event.

By heavily promoting transportation to younger audiences, TSA is helping to seed interest in younger generations about becoming professionals in transportation engineering.

6 Social Activities

6.1 Fall Bingo Tournament

On November 10th, 2010, TSA held a Bingo tournament for its students. Up for grabs were 5 gift cards for various establishments around the city of Ames. The event was well-attended, and this activity will likely be carried on in future years as well.

6.2 Bowling



TSA held a bowling night for TSA members and faculty in the Fall 2010 semester. A general lack of bowling skills provided much entertainment for all, and whether throwing gutter balls or knocking down pins, everyone had a chance to unwind.

6.3 Ice Skating

TSA held a skating night for TSA members and faculty in February of 2011. This event was held jointly with the Chi Epsilon Civil Engineering Honor Society. Again, a lack of ice skating skills made it more fun for those that attended, and it was a good way for student to relieve stress around the time as midterms approached.

6.4 Additional Events

7 Student Awards


Throughout the last year, the members of TSA received numerous awards and honors, for their work both with TSA and beyond. These award winners are listed below.



The Lincoln-Omaha-Council Bluffs Association of Transportation Engineers (LOCATE) is a local chapter of the Missouri Valley section of ITE (MOVITE). The chapter membership is comprised of professionals in the each of its namesake cities. The chapter encourages participation of both public and private sector professionals involved in traffic engineering, roadway design, planning, and other transportation specialties.

The formation of LOCATE occurred seven years ago with a purpose of improving the traffic and transportation knowledge for its members and promoting the profession within our respective communities (amongst other things). Each year, the LOCATE chapter organizes and participates in various meetings, conferences, and community outreach opportunities to achieve these purposes, 2011 being no exception.

This year was the fourth year LOCATE members participated in the award winning Making a Difference (MAD) community service project. This year also saw LOCATE's co-sponsorship of the annual ASCE/LOCATE Transportation Conference held in Omaha for the fourth straight year. Another conference LOCATE helped sponsor in 2011 was the inaugural Heartland Active Transportation Summit (HATS). The Summit was organized by the Metropolitan Area Planning Agency (MAPA) to promote active modes of transportation such as cycling, walking, mass transit, etc. Other activities in 2011 included joint meetings with NSPE and the University of Nebraska ITE student chapter. Membership

The chapter membership numbers continue to hold steady in comparison to 2010. Activities

- March 2011: The second general meeting was held in Council Bluffs, Iowa on March 24. The
 meeting featured Mike Jackson with the Iowa DOT who discussed his involvement with Western
 Iowa ITS deployment project. This project was responsible for the planning and deployment of ITS
 infrastructure in Council Bluffs, Sioux City, and along I-29. (39 in attendance)
- April 2011: The annual LOCATE/ASCE Nebraska Chapter Transportation conference was held on April 15, at the Walter Scott Conference Center on the University of Nebraska-Omaha campus. The all day event featured speakers from around the area who discussed various topics and projects including diverging diamond interchanges, the Columbus Viaduct, City of Omaha College World Series (CWS) Improvements and many others. (Attendance: 150).
- May 2011: The 6th Annual LOCATE Golf Tournament was held on May 26 at Tregaron Golf Course in Bellevue, Nebraska. The tournament was a four-person, best ball competition with lunch and prizes. Approximately 23 members participated in the event.



August 2011: The third general meeting of 2011 was a joint meeting between LOCATE and the
University of Nebraska-Lincoln ITE student chapter. The meeting was held on August 31 on campus
at the newly refurbished Whittier Building. The meeting featured presentations from students on
current research and summer internship experiences. (24 LOCATE members in Attendance along
with approximately 10 students)





- September 2011: The second conference LOCATE help sponsor, promote and participate in was the inaugural Heartland Active Transportation Summit (HATS). The summit was held in Omaha on the University of Nebraska-Omaha campus and featured both a one day summit for professionals and a second day summit for members of the community. Each day included speakers and activities that covered different aspects of active transportation (i.e. cycling, walking, transit, etc.). The summit was organized by the Metropolitan Area Planning Agency (MAPA) and featured keynote speaker, Jim Oberstar. Approximately 200 people attended the professional summit on September 30.
- October 2011: The fourth general meeting of 2011 was a joint meeting LOCATE and the Nebraska Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE). The meeting was held in Omaha on October 25, and featured two speakers; Marty Grate with the City of Omaha and Dan Owens with Lamp Rynearson and Associates. The pair discussed their experiences with the Missouri River Flood, which occurred over the summer and the subsequent mitigation efforts they were involved in. (63 in Attendance)

Making a Difference Project

This project was initiated in 2008 after the MOVITE president challenged local chapters to find ways to "make a difference" in their communities. In response, LOCATE developed an outreach program to educate local area high school students regarding safe choices when driving. The goal of the program is to discuss safe driving choices with teens that are either beginning to drive or have just begun driving. By introducing these topics to drivers at a young age, we hope to help them form good driving habits and raise their awareness regarding the various consequences associated with poor choices behind the wheel.

Currently, the program is run and maintained by volunteers within LOCATE. Mark Lutjeharms continues to organize MAD speaking engagements in Lincoln while Austin Yates coordinates things in the Omaha metro area. They also coordinate updates for the various topics, trends and other useful tools we communicate in our message to students. The content of the message is focused on making positive choices behind the wheel with regard to seat belt use, distractions, and impairment. Our presentations make use of data, facts, videos and activities to keep the audience's attention. In addition, these things are presented with an engineering "spin" to further distinguish the program from other safety presentation that they may hear.

Through these efforts the program continues to receive a warm reception by teachers, students and administrators. On many occasions, speakers received positive feedback from audience members and teachers including assurances that their behavior when driving will change as a result of the presentation.

On the heels of the program's success, professional societies in other states have begun to take notice. To be specific, the Texas ITE chapter (TexITE) and the Oklahoma Traffic Engineering Association (OTEA) contacted LOCATE in 2011 to learn more about our program. Subsequently, Mark Lutjeharms visited the interested groups and provided them with information about LOCATE's program. On April 28, 2011, Mark spoke to 135 attendees of the OTEA annual meeting, which was held at the Western Hills Guest Ranch in Sequoyah State park. He also spoke on September 15, 2011, during a Transportation Safety session of the TexITE annual meeting in Garland, Texas.

Finances

The continuing philosophy of the Board is to fully support expenses through meeting income. This strategy has proven effective once again in 2011. Annual dues were used to support the other operations of the Chapter, such as providing free meeting attendance (including meals) for students. In addition, the funds raised at the golf outing were used to provide raffle prizes at the annual meeting. To properly account for these things, chapter finances were tracked and reported at each meeting. At the end of 2011, the Chapter's account balance was \$1,100.60. 2012 TEAM ST. LOUIS ITE STUDENT CHAPTER SUPPORT ACTIVITIES

TEAM St. Louis is affiliated with two ITE student chapters: Washington University and Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. In addition, TEAM St. Louis is working to establish a new student chapter at Saint Louis University. Washington University

Established in 1974, the Washington University Student Chapter has a long history supporting ITE activities. In the spring 2012 semester the chapter is working to take tours of both the New MRB, and the bike station facilities made possible by trailnet. ITE members are working with Ms. Luten to gain field experience by assisting in the bike station study at Washington University. Students involved are also gaining experience in developing multi-modal transportation by designing a pamphlet for commuter students with locations of bike racks, showers and lobbying for short-term storage areas. All of this in addition to preparing to participate in the Midwestern ITE Traffic Bowl being held in Chicago, IL this summer!

Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville (SUIE)

In 2011, the SIUE Student Chapter enjoyed its forth full calendar year as a part of ITE since reactivation in September 2007. The Chapter maintained official recognition from the University as a registered student organization. The ITE continues to be one of the largest Civil Engineering clubs on campus by enrollment. Officials from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), Missouri Department of Transportation, and numerous firms have been invited to the chapter meetings. The SIUE Student Chapter has big plans for the coming year including: attending the annual MOVITE section meeting Nebraska, the Midwestern District Meeting in Chicago, the TRB access management meeting in Texas, the Transport Chicago conference, and the 8th International Conference on Traffic and Transportation Studies in China.



In June 2011, three members from SIUE student chapter of ITE attended the Midwestern ITE traffic bowl held in Iowa and placed 4th in the competition. 

Dave Lenczycki, Project Manager with Forest Park Forever, will make a presentation about the Forest Park Traffic Relief Route and Trolley. Forest Park Forever and City of St. Louis Parks Department are committed to positively impacting the overall park visitor experience and improving operations in Forest Park. To create a new traffic management plan for the park's busiest times, a task force was formed in 2011 representing City Parks Department, Forest Park Forever, City Streets Department, MoDOT, Police, Park Rangers, all the institutions, and attractions in Forest Park. The group aimed to address traffic management planning by implementing significant initiatives. The plan that was developed involves implementing new strategies to keep traffic and circulation moving, promote all access points and multi-modes, share all available parking resources, and improve communications to all visitors.

The largest contributors to the successful plan are a traffic relief route for vehicles and the Forest Park Trolley. The relief route plan utilizes the new trolley as the preferred approach to access the park and transport people between sites, events, and parking.

The Relief Route Plan promotes traffic circulation to prevent vehicular gridlock during the park's busiest times. The largest measurable result of a successful plan would be to prevent traffic from backing up along Hampton onto I-64. Having traffic waiting in line on I-64 to access the park is a safety problem that the relief route wants to prevent.



Working in partnership with Metro, Forest Park Forever and the City of St. Louis Parks Department, an extended **Forest Park Trolley** service is one of the largest contributors to success. By emphasizing and extending the Forest Park Trolley as a preferred transportation method for the park, between sites, events and parking, the overall planning swells into a consistent, multi-year approach to park traffic management.



bionic-inspired structures that mimics birds' bones. These structures should also be lighter thanks to the layer manufacturing that is already included in Formula 1 cars and is providing them with super light parts. Next are the concepts of having power on board that does not come from the fuel the aircraft is carrying. Solar panels mounted on the wings and fuselage can provide some power while hydrogen fuel cells could provide emission-free on board electric power while on the ground.

To that end, Airbus can become a pivotal point in the future of air travel and provide us all with an amazing flight experience that will make us come back for more.

In spite of that, let's not forget about Boeing, which has already started to change air travel with their new 787 Dreamliner aircraft. Boeing's vision into the future is to reduce fuel emissions by 75% and total energy use by 55% for their aircrafts. For this, Boeing Research and Technology developed the SUGAR (Subsonic Ultra Green Aircraft Research) Volt as an airplane design concept. This airplane could decrease fuel use in air travel by using an electric-battery/gas-turbine hybrid propulsion system. This design also shortens takeoff distance and noise of the aircraft.

Another part of Boeing's vision is to make progress in supersonic travel and see tourists jetting to cities half way across the Earth in perhaps less than an hour. Boeing boss, Mr. Thomas, even said that "New York in 12 minutes is better than a see through plane." The company is interested in developing scramjet-based access-to-space systems, which will make supersonic travel a reality. On the other hand, it could probably be a while before Concorde-style travel times become the norm again, seeing as fuel efficiency is a more pressing requirement from almost all airlines. Either way, the public can be more than sure that Boeing will make sure to deliver what is being asked of them and more.

2011 Annual Chapter Report



Executive Summary

The Kansas City Chapter of ITE marked its eighth full year as an organization in 2011. KCITE further established itself in 2011 as the organization of choice for transportation professionals in the Kansas City metropolitan area. The bi-monthly chapter meetings were well-attended, presented a variety of topics and offered networking opportunities for professionals in both the public and the private sectors. KCITE also focused on providing multiple training options for its membership, offering the chance to increase professional knowledge and earn professional development hours. The KCITE Board continues to be excited about the chapter's future and credits the success of the chapter to the hard working individuals who have made a positive impact by forming such a strong chapter base.

The chapter boundaries were established in 2003 to include the major cities within a 70-mile radius of Kansas City. This resulted in a total of 14 counties within the chapter area – seven (7) in Kansas and seven (7) in Missouri. In addition to Kansas City, the cities of Lawrence, Topeka and St. Joseph were also included in the chapter boundaries. The inclusion of these nearby cities offers the opportunity for representatives from agencies, institutions and companies throughout the metropolitan area to be fully involved in a local connection to ITE. In addition to the local agencies, institutions and companies, the KCITE chapter also includes the University of Kansas (KU) and the University of Missouri – Kansas City (UMKC). The presence of local student ITE chapter(s) enables the KCITE chapter to foster and assist these student chapters which has been an ongoing goal of the organization.

The first year that chapter monies were budgeted for student chapter sponsorships was in 2008. In 2011, the chapter continued this allocation of money towards student chapter sponsorships as well as the support of activities increasing youth awareness of the engineering profession. The student collegiate chapters that can benefit from the sponsorships are the KU and UMKC student chapters. The KU chapter has seen good staff support and continues to grow. The UMKC chapter has unfortunately seen limited student involvement and the lack of staff support. KCITE continues to reach out to both organizations to provide support. The budget that is allocated to student sponsorships covers things such as free annual membership to the chapter, free attendance to the chapter meetings and reimbursement of transportation needed to attend chapter activities.

The Chapter continued to provide a web-based resource for members to more easily access meeting schedules and other information regarding the chapter. The website is updated on a regular basis and includes information such as meeting announcements, officers, history, technical committees, governance, past meetings and presentations and, when applicable, information on candidates during chapter elections. The website is located at www.kcite.org. Also, the chapter is providing most of the meeting materials electronically to its membership thereby saving resources where possible.

In 2011, the **Excellence in Transportation Award** was awarded at the July chapter meeting. The award recognizes an organization for one or all of the following:

- Development of an innovative concept in transportation planning, design or operations;
- Innovative application of a proven concept in transportation planning, design or operations;
- Implementation of a "difficult" transportation program through perseverance in its development and promotion;
- A program or project having a significant affect on regional transportation;
- A multi-faceted transportation program or project, combining many innovative and/or well-applied concepts;
- A program or project promoting a major advance in the efficiency and/or economy of transportation.

The 2011 recipient of the annual award was City of Lee's Summit and Rhythm Engineering for the "*Real-Time Adaptive Traffic Control on Chipman Road" project.* This project was a good example of some of the award criteria, including impact on regional transportation.

11. Student Chapter Activities

KCITE supports two local student chapters. The KU chapter is an established student chapter and had been actively participating in chapter meetings and KCITE-sponsored training opportunities. KU students were also involved with the 2010 spring MOVITE meeting, serving on planning committees, volunteering at the meeting, and attending trainings.

UMKC students and staff worked to start a chapter a few years ago, however with staff and student transitions we have not seen growth of the UMKC chapter. The engineering program is small and getting faculty support and student interest in a student organization has been difficult. KCITE continues to reach-out to the University and to offer students and faculty to attend meetings and get involved with KCITE. We hope that in the future a stronger student chapter can be established and that our chapter can continue support of those students.

The budget that is allocated to student sponsorships covers things such as free annual membership to the chapter, free attendance to the chapter meetings and reimbursement of transportation needed to attend chapter activities. KCITE also offers all training activities to students, often for no cost. To obtain free members, students are asked to fill out a membership formed by a faculty advisor.

In 2011, there were no student affiliates registered as members of KCITE's organization. We only had 1 student that attended a chapter meeting this year, we feel that it is partially due to student schedules conflicting with our meeting times (students typically are not in school for the January and July meetings) and that the KU chapter is more active on campus. We support this increased activity on campus (the student chapter meets regularly) and provide assistance as requested through speaker coordination and professional representation at meetings as requested.

In addition to support of the local collegiate chapters, the KCITE board continues to investigate ways to encourage and educate youth regarding opportunities in transportation and traffic related fields. In 2010, KCITE was contacted regarding being a sponsor for the Future City competition. The Future City competition is for sixth, seventh and eighth grade students in the Great Plains region. The students develop a City using SimCity, write an essay, build a physical model, and present to judges the day of the competition. The KCITE board decided to sponsor an award that recognizes a student team that best exemplifies an innovative transportation system in their future city. The competition was held in early 2011, and KCITE is proud to start and continue its involvement with this project. KCITE hopes to continue finding more opportunities such as this to encourage the engineering profession to local youth. Funding for this sponsorship is in part available due to the support of MOVITE and sharing of the profits from the spring 2010 MOVITE meeting, hosted by KCITE.

12. Community Awareness and Involvement Activities

The fourth annual KCITE food drive was held during the July chapter meeting. We collected 336 cans of food for our community which is an increase from the previous years' collection. The food that was collected was donated to Harvesters, the Kansas City's food bank. To encourage the membership to participate, those donating food were provided a meeting discount. Additionally, a friendly competition was encouraged between the member agencies. The agency/company that donated the largest amount of food per person was BHC Rhodes. A special thanks was extended to all of our members for making this event such a great success, and the KCITE Board plans to continue to make this an annual event. A copy of the flyer that was used to advertise this event is included in the Appendix.

13. Technical Activities

KCITE hosts training opportunities throughout the year. Training locations vary and are dependent upon current interest within the KCITE community. KCITE uses web seminars sponsored by ITE and other professional organizations such as ASCE and

FHWA to meet our annual training goal. Sponsorship of training events from public agencies and private companies is encouraged to minimize expenses and is often offered at no cost to the attendee.

The annual goal according to KCITE's Policy Manual is to provide our members with the opportunity to receive at least 15 PDHs per year through chapter meetings and sponsored training events. During 2011, a total of about 32 PDHs were offered to KCITE members and affiliates through chapter meetings and sponsored training opportunities.

Based on the interest from the membership about the updates to the Highway Capacity Manual and Accessible Pedestrian Signals, KCITE teamed up with public and private agencies and provided the following training opportunities:

14. Awards Program

In 2004, the Chapter established an **Excellence in Transportation Award** that is presented annually to an organization(s) for an outstanding transportation project in the chapter area. The award is structured very similarly to the award sponsored by MOVITE. In 2011, the seventh recipient of the KCITE Excellence in Transportation Award was City of Lees Summit, MO and Rhythm Engineering for the successful application of "*Real-Time Adaptive Traffic Control on Chipman Road*".

Real-time adaptive traffic control was installed at 15 busy intersections in Lees Summit, MO. By adapting to traffic demand, the adaptive system reduced travel time on the Chipman Rd corridor by as much as 55 percent. This project was a successful coordination between federal, state, local government and private industry and has had an impact on regional transportation.

15. Chapter Website

The KCITE board has continued to focus on the chapter website and development of a source for members and non-members to find information on local activities. The website is utilized to publicize all chapter meetings, training activities, and other events. Visitors to the site can find chapter meeting agendas, minutes, presentations, board and committee member listings, contact information for board members, and other information.

A member of the chapter, Gnani Mahalingam, has graciously donated his services for several years organizing and assisting the board with the website operations. Gnani held a training with several of the board members to educate the board on how to post to the website and best utilize this resource. The board and chapter are very appreciative of Gnani and his dedication to assisting the chapter.

During 2011 the board implemented to have a single e-mail to use for all chapter e-mails. KCITE board members can now communicate with the chapter regarding upcoming events using the email address info@kcite.org. This e-mail address is being used to contact membership regarding chapter activities, collect registrations for chapter events, and provide a single point of contact for those interested in more information regarding KCITE.

The KCITE board is continually looking for ways to better serve our membership, to most efficiently use the funds we have available, and improve chapter operations. This year we focused on being "green" by better serving our membership regarding the dispersal of chapter meeting agendas and receipts. In an effort to better serve the membership and go green (save resources) in 2010 we had started e-mailing certificates of attendance to members attending the trainings and chapter meetings. Now, we have extended this further in 2011 by also providing agendas and receipts electronically. However, based on the request from the membership to continue receiving paper receipts at the meetings, we are planning to revert to the paper receipts.

16. Coordination with MOVITE

KCITE as an organization is in a unique situation as we encompass not only multiple local jurisdictions (City's) but also two states. With membership on both sides of the state line we have the opportunity to work with both the Missouri and Kansas directors who coordinate and provide a direct link to MOVITE. Both Mike Wahlstedt (Missouri) and Guy Alon (Kansas) have worked with the board to inform us of MOVITE activities, offer support, and gather ideas of how MOVITE can assist KCITE (and KCITE support MOVITE). We look forward to continuing this relationship and assisting the directors in achieving their goals.



However, at least one member of the organization must be a member of KCITE. Nominations shall be submitted to the KCITE Chapter President no later than March 31st, 2011. 

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2011, the Ozarks Chapter of the Institute of Transportation Engineers celebrated its ninth year as the leading organization for transportation professionals in southwest Missouri. The year brought about much change to the organization with a renewed focus of better accommodating its member's needs with information and educational opportunities that facilitate the organizations growth and relevancy.

The OCITE area encompasses twenty-four counties in the southwest Missouri region, which includes the Springfield metropolitan area, Joplin, Branson, and Lebanon. Participants not only include professionals from state and local public agencies, consulting firms, and companies, but also from the newly formed Cooperative Engineering Program between Missouri State University and the Missouri University of Science & Technology. OCITE has continued to support student involvement in the chapter and further their knowledge of the transportation field as these students are the future of transportation engineering in the area.

The OCITE board met at the beginning of 2011, acknowledging that the membership and participation numbers had dwindled with the downturn in the economy and the organization was in need of a rejuvenation to increase member participation in the organization. The board set forth a goal of providing our members with a minimum of 15 continuing education credits locally in Springfield. Though the OCITE board always encourages travel to MOVITE and ITE meetings, it realizes that operating budgets may not allow for out-of-state travel so the focus was on providing each member with enough credits to cover half of the required two-year total for licensure.

The largest change to the organization came from a lunch conversation with Shawn Leight and Carrie Falkenrath at the 2010 Fall MOVITE Meeting in Oklahoma City. Shawn and Carrie talked about the changes that TEAM had implemented years prior when TEAM's membership numbers had diminished. With ideas for change prompted by the discussion with Shawn and Carrie, OCITE modified the location and format for the annual technical conference. On May 24th 2011, the 8th Annual OCITE Technical Conference was held at the Ozark Community Center in Ozark, Missouri. The conference was again cosponsored with the Ozark Mountain Section of the American Planning Association - Missouri Chapter and transportation planners were able to earn certification maintenance credits to maintain their membership in the American Institute of Certified Planners. The difference with this conference from years past was the bottom-line cost. By using the community center, OCITE was able to provide six continuing education credits for \$35, a significant decrease from the \$90 charged in 2010. OCITE did not ask for consultant or vendor sponsorships due to the effects of the economy. This change saw attendance grow dramatically from 39 in attendance in 2010 to 69 in attendance in 2011. Tom Ryan's guidance was integral to the success of the conference; with his leadership the board was able to confirm the speakers at the event. He did this while actively working with TEAM on the development of the 2011 ITE Meeting and Exhibit program in St. Louis.

Because of the change to the technical conference, the 2011 OCITE Golf Tournament was self-sustaining with voluntary contributions made by our consultants and vendors.



A continued focus of OCITE this year was to foster the relationship between students and the members of OCITE by contributing to the scholarship fund for students pursuing a degree in transportation engineering or closely related field. Members donated \$194.00 to the fund in 2011 for our future scholarship, bringing the total to \$3,872.91. OCITE will have additional deposits contributed by the American Planning Association that were earned from partnering at the Technical Conference will be contributed to this fund in 2012.

OCITE concluded the year with one final change for 2011. The Holiday Award Ceremony was moved from a semi-formal evening event to a casual lunch meeting. In 2009, the ceremony was moved to an evening celebration with moderate success but due to family obligations and location issues around the holidays, many members and even award recipients were finding it difficult to attend. The change was showed minimal attendance increases but the membership in attendance was supportive of the change.

MEMBERSHIP

TECHNICAL ACTIVITIES

On May 24th, 2011, in Ozark, Missouri OCITE hosted the 8th Annual Technical Conference "Meeting Regional Transportation Needs" with sponsoring host American Planning Association at the Ozark Community Center. There were 69 members in attendance including several Missouri State students and members from KCITE, CMITE, and TEAM. This year's conference gave attendees six continuing education credits for \$35 including full breakfast and lunch. The program included speeches from Kevin Ward, FHWA, and Jim Anderson, Springfield Area Chamber of Commerce, and presentations including Safe Routes to School, Arterial Travel Times, LED Technologies, and KC Major Street Plan. The conference was held in dual track format with one track catering to transportation planning and the other to transportation engineering operations. At the conference, OCITE took up a matching collection for Disaster Relief in Joplin.

In addition to the Technical Conference, OCITE was the leading organization to assist and coordinate the revamping of the Traffic Practices Guidebook. OCITE requested the voluntary assistance of the other Missouri MOVITE Chapters. With the assistance of the KCITE and TEAM, the guidebooks format was improved, the chapters were evaluated and rewritten, and the material was submitted to Missouri LTAP. The guidebook is currently being developed into a class for smaller counties and communities across the state.

OPERATIONS TRACK

SAFETY EDGE - MARC THORNSBERRY, FHWA

The Safety Edge Presentation will provide attendees with an overview of FHWA's Every Day Counts (EDC) Safety Edge initiative. The Safety Edge is a practical low-cost solution to reduce pavement edge-related crashes, by shaping the edge of the pavement to 30 degrees using a commercially available device (called a shoe) that is attached to the paver. Attendees will learn about the safety impacts of pavement edge drop-offs from both a national and Missouri perceptive. Nationally, roadway departures are a contributing factor in 53% of all fatal crashes. Attendees will also learn about the short- and long-term benefits of deploying the Safety Edge in terms of pavement safety and durability. In addition, an overview of the conclusions and recommendations of a recent *Safety Valuation of the Safety Edge Treatment* report conducted by the Highway Safety Information System (HSIS) will be presented.

MSE WALLS - MATT PIERSON, MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY

The increased use of mechanically stabilized earth (MSE) technology has created many design challenges. This presentation will discuss one example, laterally loaded foundation elements that must pass through the MSE structure. Topics include: Construction, instrumentation, testing, and numerical modeling of a full scale MSE wall with foundation elements passing through the reinforced zone of the wall. Conclusions, implications for design, and recommendations for future research will also be discussed.

ARTERIAL TRAVEL TIMES - GREG OWENS, MODOT

The ability to reliably measure arterial performance through the amount of time to travel from point to point has long been a difficult value to acquire. Spot speed measurements that work well on freeways do not carry over to arterials, and previous methods of collecting data have been either too cumbersome or too expensive. MoDOT's St. Louis District is on the leading edge of 2 new technologies that have turned the problem of collecting reliable arterial travel time data into a problem of sorting through an avalanche of useful data, and is here today to present on how they arrived to this point and plans for the future.

LED TECHNOLOGY - TOM RYAN, HDR

Life Expectancy Evaluation and Replacement Schedule Development for LED Traffic Indications (final report: http://library.modot.mo.gov/RDT/reports/TRyv1001/or11015.pdf) presentation discussed the recently completed research evaluation conducted by Missouri Science and Technology (MS&T) for the Missouri Department of Transportation. This LED traffic indications evaluation answer the question regarding developing a cost-effective replacement program based actual LED degradation assessment of indication's type, indication's age and indication's manufacturer. This evaluation did develop an innovative automated method and device that measure LED indications while traveling at roadway speeds. This presentation was made by Tom Ryan who served as report quality review and adviser on this project.

TMC/ATMS - JASON HAYNES, CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, & ADAM HUMPHREY, MODOT

The new Transportation Management Center is a partnership project between MoDOT and the City of Springfield. The TMC was designed by Esterly Schneider & Associates and began construction in January 2010 by Denali Construction for a total cost of \$3.2 million (\$1.5 million in federal earmarks and \$1.7 million of state and local funds). The TMC monitors over 250 state and local traffic signals, monitors

freeway and arterial with 42 cameras, collects traffic data from 32 wireless vehicle detectors, provides real-time traffic information via ozarkstraffic.info website and soon to be dynamic message signs on freeways and arterials, and improves traffic coordination between agencies and potentially reducing travel delays. The additional cameras, new arterial and freeway detectors, and dynamic message signs are all parts of the Advanced Traffic Management System that will give drivers more immediate traffic information to make more timely decisions on what routes to avoid and allows traffic engineers to make temporary traffic signal changes to better manage traffic during incidents.

PLANNING TRACK

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL- DAWNE GARDNER, MODOT, & TERRY WHALEY, OZARK GREENWAYS

This session will focus on the national Safe Routes to School Program. We will discuss what is happening on a national, state and more importantly local level. There are many projects and/or activities that can make up a SRTS program, such as School Route Walking Maps, trail signs, sidewalks, walking school buses, etc. We will look at both infrastructure and non-infrastructure projects that have been accomplished or are under development on a local level in southwest Missouri. Starting a SRTS program can be challenging, therefore, it is important to understand what challenges local communities face when planning for their SRTS activities. In summary, this session will discuss what SRTS actually is, benefits that surround SRTS activities for schools, neighborhoods and local communities, funding, local success as well as focusing on the health benefits of a SRTS program can bring to the table.

ALTERNATE TRANSPORTATION PLANNING - PETE RADECKI, DRURY UNIVERSITY

This session will focus on motivations for Drury to encourage use of alternate transportation, show plan concepts, and provide overview of the plan. By focusing on alternative transportation, parking demand around campus with be minimized while passing cost saving onto the students by not having to provide and maintain addition facilities. The ultimate goal of the alternate transportation plan concepts is to provide a convenient, cost effective transportation solution that eliminates the need for personal cars. The elements needed to achieve the goal are bike storage, bike ways, bike supply and repair, bus access, and car access. The effort is going to take collaboration with City of Springfield and CU.

RAIL/HIGHWAY PLANNING - MIKE MACPHERSON, CITY OF SPRINGFIELD

The Springfield railroad reconfiguration and grade separation effort is a highly challenging and aggressive approach undertaken by City government. It has resulted in a series of sophisticated recommendation for engineering alternative to achieve critically important goals for the City of Springfield. These implementation objectives may be capable of being met using a very narrow range of funding options in a creative combination which is now available through new Federal Transportation Reauthorization allowing public-private funding effort. The process will require adequate dialogue and Congressional representation.

ROAD SAFETY AUDIT- RICHARD STONE, CITY OF COLUMBIA

Road safety audits and assessments (RSAs) provide agencies with useful long term and short term planning tools to address roadway conditions. Valuable insight is gained from a formal RSA utilizing NCHRP Synthesis 336 guideline. These guidelines provide a framework for a formal audit. Agencies can then use the knowledge gained to perform less formal, but still useful, roadway assessments at other locations using internal staff resources. As funding continues to become harder to come by, being able to provide thoughtful evaluation of the needs and benefits of proposed improvements is critical. RSAs are one tool that can help provide clarity for systematic improvements.

CONTINUOUS FLOW INTERSECTION – RYAN PIERCE, MODOT

A continuous flow intersection or CFI is an innovative at-grade, signalized intersection design. By moving the left turn lanes several hundred feet back from the crossroad and running the left turn traffic to the outside the left turn phases are able to be removed and run concurrently with the crossroad through traffic. This allows more green time to be assigned to the mainline where it is needed the most. This presentation gives an update based on lessons learned from the MO 30/Gravois Bluffs-Summit CFI, which was built late 2007 in Fenton MO.

KANSAS CITY LONG RANGE TRANSPORATION PLAN - ROBERT FRAZIER, HDR

Recently the communities of Kansas City, Missouri and Gardner, Kansas undertook long range transportation planning projects. While they are both part of the Kansas City metro area, these communities are very different. The impetus and goals for their planning were also very different. This presentation will explore both projects, comparing the why, what, who, and how for each. The goal is to provide insights into how scope, scale and other issues can affect important transportation planning efforts. The presentation will also give some of the details for each plan in an effort to share possible approaches for other similar projects.

IMPLEMENTING STRUCTURAL BMP'S IN PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY - THOMAS KIMES, HDR

Stormwater management has traditionally focused on issues of water quantity. The latest step in the stormwater management is to address issues of water quality. This approach results in Best Management Practices (BMP) that may be policy-based, operational, or structural. Structural BMPs are often private. As a parallel project to the Major Street Plan, Kansas City is examining the use of BMPs within public rights-of-way. A significant driver for the public space is maintenance. This presentation describes the City's research on the state-of-the-art for applying BMPs within the right-of-way and previews recommendations that the City plans to adopt.
