#### INTRODUCTION

MISSION: The mission of MOVITE is to bring individuals together to advance the knowledge and skills of transportation professionals.

VISION: MOVITE will be the premier transportation organization of choice with an active membership that advances the profession.

2017 was a year to focus on our core mission and vision. Every meeting, be it in a board room, conference room, or teleconference, placed an emphasis on striving toward these statements. We gathered together in various settings, venues, and atmospheres. We used those gatherings as an opportunity to advance the profession, and enhance connections at the same time. We continue to be the go to organization for transportation in the region and are poised to continue that strength.

2017 was also a time for reflection on MOVITE's financial status. Times of plenty had yielded spending ideas that were showing trends of unsustainability. The board did a great job of seriously considering spending goals, and generally found that the myriad of ways MOVITE was supporting students was getting a little out of hand. Some of these measures were reigned in or consolidated to provide for a strong financial position into the future. MOVITE continues to be a strong supporter of its young student members through an assortment of activities and financial benefits.

The MOVITE board fully implemented the practice of holding a conference call with chapter representatives ahead of in-person board meetings. This has resulted in greater participation from chapter's, with more time to share their message. It has also resulted in shorter MOVITE board meetings, allowing the board to hone its focus on current items that demand attention.

The MOVITE board approved a new logo in 2017, mirroring the national logo along with many districts and sections. The new logo also identifies MOVITE as part of ITE so that it can stand alone. It is thought the old logo was meant to be paired with the old national ITE logo prior to its update in the 1990s. The new logo was unveiled to the membership at the annual meeting and was greeted with a round of applause.

The MOVITE Section continues to be one of the strongest within ITE. We have a large number of members volunteering their time at the ITE International level. We have a significant number of professionals who have graduated from Leadership ITE. We have had several members that have served as ITE International Presidents (including the 2017 ITE President, Shawn Leight). We have over 700 members and that number continues to rise. We have a large operating budget and our dues are some of the lowest of all the other sections in the organization.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

The MOVITE Section covers a large geographic area that includes Nebraska, lowa, Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, and Arkansas, which makes meeting and working together a challenge. The Board is very appreciated of the support we receive from our membership and we are thankful for their strong support for ITE at all levels.

Annually the Board discusses the amount of the annual dues to determine if there is a need to increase. With the recent increase in dues as implemented in 2017, the board determined that no increase was necessary for 2018 dues.

Over the course of the Spring 2016 Board Meeting, there was careful thought and discussion about our income, expenditures and current dues levels. The Board decided to explore the idea of possibly increasing the dues to insure the financial health of MOVITE into the future. Through the research that was conducted by the Board, it was determined that our expenditures have increased in recent years as a result of the dues structure change at the international level and MOVITE's increased student spending. It was also found that MOVITE's dues were some of the lowest section dues in the organization.

Ultimately the Board determined that it was appropriate to raise the dues to \$20 from \$12. The Board only had the authority to increase the dues by the amount of \$5 in any given year. As a result, the request to increase the dues an additional \$3 had to be approved by the general membership. An election was held and the membership approved the dues increase with an approval of over 80%. The dues increase took effect in 2017.










#### **TEAM ST. LOUIS ANNUAL FAIR**

Our biggest event of the year continues to be our annual TEAM STL Fair. The thirteenth annual fair was held Thursday, September 7, 2017 at the St. Nicholas Family Life Center. Registered engineers in attendance had the opportunity to obtain a maximum of 7 PDHs. #### **AWARDS PROGRAM**

In 2010, we revised the TEAM Bylaws to create an annual awards program. This year the TEAM St. Louis Transportation Achievement award went to Greg Horn. Greg Horn was the District Engineer for the St. Louis division of the Missouri Department of Transportation.

Greg and the district's nearly 720 employees are responsible for planning, design, construction and maintenance of 6,000 miles of roads in Franklin, Jefferson, St. Charles and St. Louis counties and the City of St. Louis.

Prior to his role as District Engineer, Greg served as MoDOT's Project Director for the New Mississippi River Bridge connecting Missouri and Illinois in St. Louis City. The \$700 million project is the largest bi-state project in the region's history. In this position, he was responsible for coordinating property acquisition, design, and construction to ensure the project was built on time and within budget.

Greg, a native of Webster Groves, Mo., is a registered professional engineer. He received his Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from the University of Missouri, Columbia. Upon graduation, he started his career at MoDOT in 1984 in MoDOT's St. Louis construction department. Three years later, he was asked to serve as a Resident Engineer to build the Highway 40 Missouri River Bridge between St. Louis and St. Charles counties.

In 1996, Greg piloted MoDOT's Area Engineer position. He was responsible for determining and prioritizing all MoDOT activities in the City of St. Louis, and was involved with the location study for the New Mississippi River Bridge. His work served as the model for a position that is now used successfully by MoDOT statewide.

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#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Ozarks Chapter of the Institute of Transportation Engineers (OCITE) continued the tradition of being southwest Missouri's choice organization for transportation professionals in 2017. This year, the chapter celebrated it's fourteenth year. Bi-monthly meetings were well attended, attendance at the technical seminar increased, and two scholarships were awarded to students who are pursuing careers in transportation.

The OCITE chapter serves twenty-four counties in southwest Missouri. The membership is made up of professionals from state and local agencies, consulting firms, and university faculty. Both the Missouri University of Science & Technology and Missouri State University are within OCITE's service area. The chapter has made a tradition of hosting events that promote student involvement.

The annual OCITE Technical Seminar was held on July 12 at the Springfield-Greene County Botanical Center. The chapter exceeded expectations with 78 people in attendance including 2 students. This was OCITE's best attended technical seminar in recent years. The success of the 2017 Technical Seminar can be credited to the event's sponsors: CJW Transportation Consultants, Crawford Murphy & Tilly, HDR, TranSystems, Olsson Associates, Terracon, and Anderson Engineering. Presentations were made by 10 different speakers covering topics that included roundabout design, planning and constructing trails, considerations in right-of-way acquisition, revitalization projects, automated corridors, and MoDOT programs. In keeping with OCITE tradition, a food drive to benefit Ozarks Food Harvest was held at the event. 46 pounds of non-perishable food items were collected and donated. After the technical seminar, a sponsor's reception was held at Schultz & Dooley's.

OCITE held five chapter meetings during 2017. These meetings were held at various locations around Springfield and were well attended. Each meeting included a presentation on a transportation related topic with the opportunity for continuing education credits.

In December, the Chapter hosted an Awards Banquet. The award for Transportation Professional of the Year was presented to Brian Weiler, Director of Aviation for the Springfield-Branson National Airport. The Transportation Achievement Award was presented to the Missouri Department of Transportation, the City of Springfield, and Millstone Weber, LLC for their successful coordination on the 65 Rebuild Project. Transportation Professional of the Year: Brian Weiler Brian Weiler was presented the Transportation Professional of the Year Award for his work as the Director of Aviation at the Springfield-Branson National Airport. Under Brian's leadership, the airport has seen consistent and record growth. He has overseen the advancement of several capital initiatives including the new U.S. Customs and Border Protection Terminal Facility, the Premier Flight Center in partnership with Ozarks Technical Community College, and expanded general aviation facilities. Brian has been a supporter of economic development for our region and a model transportation professional.



**Transportation Achievement:** Missouri Department of Transportation, City of Springfield, and Millstone Weber, LLC



The coordination efforts of the Missouri Department of Transportation, the City of Springfield, and Millstone Weber, LLC on the 65 Rebuild project won the Transportation Achievement Award. The Missouri Department of Transportation initiated a project to rebuild the 45-year-old pavement along U.S. Route 65 in Springfield by temporarily closing sections of Route 65 during construction. Through extensive coordination with the City of Springfield to reroute the displaced traffic and phenomenal efforts by the contractor, Millstone Weber, LLC to keep this project on schedule, a project that could have been viewed negatively became a great construction success story.



#### **Distinguished Service:** King Coltrin

The award for distinguished service went to 2009 OCITE President, King Coltrin. King was recognized for over 25 years of service in the transportation profession and significant contributions to the community. King has been a member of ITE since 1994 and was a founding member of OCITE. In addition to his many professional accomplishments, King has been an avid volunteer serving on the Ozarks Transportation Organization's Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee and the Technical Planning Committee, The Ozark Greenways Technical Planning Committee, and the City of Springfield's Planning and Zoning Commission. # 2017 Annual Chapter Report



### **Executive Summary**

The Kansas City Chapter of ITE (KCITE) celebrated its fourteenth year in 2017. KCITE continues to provide the best venue for transportation professionals in the Kansas City metropolitan area to earn PDH's for PE and PTOE requirements, build relationships with colleagues, and learn new information related to transportation. The KCITE Board spends time not only selecting presentation topics that are new to the membership, but also looks for meeting locations that are new or have been historically successful for KCITE meetings. The bi-monthly chapter meetings continue to be well-attended with presentations on a variety of topics that appeal to professionals in both the public and the private sectors. KCITE also provides multiple training events for its membership, offering more in depth and specific training opportunities. These events create ample opportunities for our membership to network and obtain professional development hours (15 total offered). The KCITE Board is excited about the chapter's future and credits the success of the chapter to the hard-working individuals who have made a positive impact by forming such a strong chapter base.

The KCITE Chapter boundaries were established in 2003 to include the major cities within a 70-mile radius of Kansas City, encompassing over 20 counties. This offers the opportunity for representatives from agencies, institutions and companies throughout the metropolitan area to be fully involved in a local connection to ITE. The KCITE Chapter also includes the University of Kansas (KU) and the University of Missouri – Kansas City (UMKC). The presence of local student ITE chapters enables KCITE to foster and assist these student chapters, an ongoing goal of the organization.

For the past eight years, KCITE has sponsored the Great Plains (Kansas, Missouri, and Colorado) Future City Competition where students of 6th, 7th, and 8th grades participate in a national competition to build a future city. The competition was held on January 21, 2017 and KCITE awarded the "Present It" Award for the team with the best communication to the New Lakewood team from St. Matthew Catholic School in Topeka, Kansas. The chapter scholarship funds enable continued support of students while increasing awareness of the transportation profession. Additionally, KCITE held a chapter meeting in Lawrence on KU's campus. We had a great student turn-out and educators and students presented on their Transportation Engineering Analysis Laboratory (TEAL) including their driving simulator.

In 2017, the Excellence in Transportation Award was awarded to HDR, Kansas City Streetcar Authority and the City of Kansas City, Missouri for the Kansas City Streetcar. Each year the award is presented to an organization (government agency, legislative body, consulting firm, industry, or other private-sector organization) in the categories of transportation planning, operations and facilities, located within the Chapter boundaries. All submittals are submitted to MOVITE for additional awards and this year, the MOVITE Transportation Achievement Award was awarded to the City of Grandview for the MO-150 Outer Roads Project.

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### 1. Administration

The KCITE Chapter is governed by the Chapter Board of Direction. The officers consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, Member Director, Affiliate Director, and the Past President. Each year a chapter member is elected for the Board to occupy the position of Member Director and every two years an affiliate member is elected for the position of Affiliate Director. Elections are conducted every year during the month of November and candidates for the Director positions are open for any member or affiliate member of the private or public sector. The following year the Member Director is moved to the Secretary/Treasurer Officer position. Likewise, the other officers move up to the next officer position until becoming the Past President. The exception to this is the Affiliate Director, who serves a two-year term on the Board.

In 2017, the Member Director and Affiliate Director positions were up for election. The Member Director and Affiliate Director were to be elected among the membership of the private sector. To keep a balance of representation from the public and private sectors, candidates for the Director positions alternate between the two sectors during each election cycle. The 2017 elections (for the 2018 Board) were held in mid-November and early December of 2017 and were administered using our chapter website supported by StarChapter. The online election process was set up to ensure that each vote would be confidential, and that no person could vote more than once. Janelle Clayton, Merge Midwest Engineering, LLC, was elected as the Member Director and David MacDonald, Traffic Control Corporation, was re-elected for Affiliate Director for the 2018 Board of Direction. Results are shown in the Appendix of this report.

### 5. Budget and Dues Structure

The 2017 budget was approved by the Board of Direction on January 17, 2017 and was approved by the chapter meeting attendees on January 19, 2017. The original philosophy of the Board has been, and remains to be, that chapter meeting costs be fully supported by the fees charged for each meeting. The funds from annual dues have been used to support the other operations of the Chapter for items such as door prizes, speaker gifts and awards. Since the commissioning of the new website in 2013, monthly website fees

are now incurred for ongoing support, operation and maintenance of the website. These fees are primarily offset sale through the of corporate sponsorships. Sponsor's logos are displayed on the website with a link to their company's website, and the logos are displayed on the presentation screen before chapter meetings. support and are encouraged to do so. With the addition of the designation of lifetime membership to the KCITE by-laws and policy manual in 2009, Lifetime Members of ITE may be offered free membership in KCITE. Currently, the chapter has two Lifetime Members; however, a third lifetime member (posthumous) was approved by the Board in 2017 for Mr. Grant Bowerman. Mr. Bowerman was a longtime Member of KCITE that was very involved in planning the golf-tournament each year and recently passed. In memory of Mr. Bowerman's dedication to the transportation industry in Kansas City, the Board voted to name the annual golf tournament on his behalf and collect donations for the American Cancer Society. As described above, the income from annual dues is used to support the various operations of the Chapter.

### 6. Membership

In 2017, KCITE experienced a significant growth in membership. Much of the growth is due to recruitment from our active members as well as our website keeping a database of past meeting attendees. Once someone attends a KCITE event, their email address is added to the website database and they are subscribed to receive all emails about upcoming meetings, trainings and membership dues.

Additionally, the student membership increased slightly from last year due to hosting a chapter meeting at the University of Kansas. With hopes to increase student involvement

and membership even more for 2018, we are looking to host a chapter meeting at or near the University of Missouri - Kansas City (UMKC) campus. We are also looking at ways to help UMKC reinstate their ITE Student Chapter, thus increasing student membership. We are also encouraging our membership to attend and / or present at the KU ITE Student Chapter meetings. We are optimistic that our membership will continue to grow and join the ITE parent organization as the Board becomes more proficient with the features and capabilities of new website. For instance, the website makes it easier for the Board to identify and contact prospective members and encourage them to join.

Income slightly outweighed expenses in 2017 due to excellent planning of chapter meetings and utilizing sponsors for our annual golf tournament prizes. It was noted that the website sponsorship income appears to be less than anticipated. However, most of the sponsorships were paid in 2016 and not reflected in the 2017 income.

KCITE continues to use our standardized process for transferring money from Paypal. The Board previously agreed on an amount of money (\$200) that would always reside in the KCITE Paypal account, and after each chapter meeting, all funds in the Paypal account above the \$200 base would be transferred to the regular KCITE bank account.

### 8. Meetings

KCITE typically holds chapter meetings six (6) times a year on the second Thursday during the months of January, March, May, July, September, and November. Meeting locations vary and are sometimes dependent upon the meeting topic. The Arrangements Committee also strives to hold meetings in various parts of the chapter area to encourage attendance by all members regardless of their location. An emphasis is placed on holding half of the meetings in Kansas and half in Missouri, within the Kansas City Metro Area, as appropriate.

### 10. Community Awareness and Involvement Activities

### 11. Technical Activities

KCITE hosts various technical or training activities throughout the year. Training locations and topics vary and are dependent upon current interest within the KCITE community. The annual goal, according to KCITE's Policy Manual, is to provide our members with the opportunity to receive at least 15 PDH's through chapter meetings (6 PDH's) and training activities (9 PDH's). In 2017, KCITE offered a total of 15.0 PDH's which exceed the goal for the training outreach. All detailed information is in the Appendix.

Sponsorship of training activities by public agencies and private companies is encouraged to minimize expenses for our members, as trainings have typically been offered at no cost to the attendee. KCITE has focused on workshop and hands-on type training activities.

### 12. Student Chapter Activities

KCITE supports two local student chapters. The University of Kansas (KU) chapter is an established student chapter. Several students have attended and presented at KCITE chapter meetings and participated in KCITE-sponsored training opportunities. In 2017, KCITE had 3 student affiliate members, all from KU, and hosted the September Chapter Meeting on the KU campus. Many students attended the meeting and helped with the technical tour. We would still like to increase our student involvement in the future. We strongly encourage members of KCITE to support the Student Chapter's activities on campus (the Student Chapter meets on the first Friday of each month, when school is in session, over the lunch hour) and provide assistance through speaker coordination and professional representation at meetings. University of Missouri Kansas City (UMKC) students and staff worked to start a chapter several years ago, however, with staff and student transitions the UMKC chapter fell apart. KCITE continues to reach-out to the University and encourage students and faculty to attend meetings and get involved with KCITE. We hope that with the recent growth of the engineering program in recent years an ITE student chapter can be re-established and that KCITE can continue support of those students. Additionally, we have discussed hosting a KCITE chapter meeting on or near UMKC in 2018 to encourage more involvement.

KCITE continues to offer student sponsorship in the form of free annual membership to the chapter, free attendance to chapter meetings, and reimbursement of transportation to attend chapter activities. KCITE also offers all training activities to students, for a reduced fee or no fee at all.

### 14. Chapter Website

Beginning in 2013, KCITE entered into an agreement with a vendor called StarChapter to host and create a new website for the chapter. StarChapter markets its services to local volunteer run chapters of professional organizations. The service allows the Board to conduct several of our different functions through the new website. Our e-mails, meeting and training event registration, elections and data storage are all accessed through the website, instead of the separate platforms that were previously used. This report and most of the appendices can be accessed electronically through the website.


The new website continues to be a source for members and non-members to find information on local activities. The website can be found at <a href="www.kcite.org">www.kcite.org</a>. The website is utilized to publicize all chapter meetings, training activities, and other transportation related events or trainings. Visitors to the website can find chapter meeting agendas, minutes, previous presentations, board and committee member listings, contact information for board members, and other information.

The most significant change that has come from the new website is that a profile is created for each member. Members are assigned a user name and password, allowing them to log in to the website using their profile. Once logged in, members can register for events or update membership information. That information is instantly updated and stored in a location and format that is easy for the Board to access. Several other beneficial features have included the ability to pay for meetings and memberships by credit card. Microsoft Outlook appointments can be generated for events, so they can be added to calendars. The Board can easily generate reports about meetings, attendance, memberships, and dues from a secure administrative section of the website. An additional feature KCITE has been utilizing is the classified section where members can view local job postings. This helps members know of local opportunities. There are many more features in StarChapter that can be implemented by KCITE. These features should lead to more improvements to the website and benefits to the membership in the future as the Board becomes more familiar with the service.

The efforts taken to improve the KCITE website has been recognized by members and MOVITE. In 2015 & 2016 MOVITE awarded KCITE with the Best Chapter Website Award within the MOVITE region.

In 2017, the KCITE Board decided it was necessary to establish a webmaster to help keep documents organized and the website updated. Unfortunately, the member who volunteered moved out of the KCITE boundaries before much was established, so we are currently in search for a new volunteer in 2018.

In 2015, KCITE embraced social media with LinkedIn, Facebook and live Twitter feeds during our meetings. Since then, we have continued to grow our social media presence and have 517 followers between multiple platforms in which we share and retweet information related to transportation.



### 15. Coordination with MOVITE

KCITE as an organization is in a unique situation as we encompass not only multiple local jurisdictions (City's) but also two states. With membership on both sides of the state line we have the opportunity to work with both the Missouri and Kansas directors who coordinate and provide a direct link to MOVITE. In fact, KCITE's current president, David Church has served as the Kansas Director. Brian Geiger is serving his second year as the Kansas Director for MOVITE and has been an active member of KCITE, serving on both of KCITE's Training and Arrangement committees and regularly attending chapter meetings. Both Dane Seiler (Missouri) and Brian Geiger (Kansas) have worked with the

Board in 2017 to inform us of MOVITE activities, offer support, and gather ideas of how MOVITE can assist KCITE (and KCITE support MOVITE). In 2017, MOVITE Kansas Director elections were held and Kendra Miller, current KCITE's Past President, was elected to serve in 2018. We look forward to continuing the strong relationship we have had in the past with MOVITE and assisting the directors in achieving their goals.

Several KCITE members attended the Spring and Fall MOVITE meetings including the Past-President. Additionally, KCITE members serve as speakers, vendors and board members of MOVITE. In 2018, the Fall MOVITE conference will be held in Lenexa, Kansas. Many KCITE members, including the President, Past-President and committee members, have volunteered to create the Local Arrangements Committee (LAC) to help plan the meeting.

# **Summary**

The Lincoln-Omaha-Council Bluffs Association of Transportation Engineers (LOCATE), a local chapter of the Missouri Valley section of ITE (MOVITE), celebrated its twelfth year as a chapter in 2017. Through the leadership of our president, Chris Rolling, the chapter continued its commitment to providing professional development opportunities for public and private sector transportation professionals in the Lincoln-Omaha-Council Bluffs area as well continued support of the Drive Smart program.

In addition to our general meetings, LOCATE continued its participation in:

# Membership

# **Drive Smart**

This project was initiated in 2008 after the MOVITE president challenged local chapters to find ways to "make a difference" in their



communities. In response, LOCATE developed an outreach program to educate local area high school students regarding safe choices when driving. The goal of the program is to discuss safe driving choices with teens that are either beginning to drive or have just begun driving. By introducing these topics to drivers at a young age, we hope to help them form good driving habits and raise their awareness regarding the various consequences associated with poor choices behind the wheel.

At the end of 2015, this program became independent of the LOCATE organization. However, it is still primarily staffed and run by LOCATE members and receives sponsorship through LOCATE. Recent budget surpluses in LOCATE, along with income from the recent increase in annual member dues, have allowed the organization to provide a small budget for presentation materials, handouts, and an annual appreciation event for the presenters.

The program is run and maintained by Brian Johnson and Jake Weiss. Brian organizes presentations in volunteers within Lincoln and Jake takes care of Omaha metro presentations. Together, they have scheduled presentations that reached 2,636 students in 2017. Cumulatively since its inception, the Drive Smart Presentation has been shown to over 18,500 students. **Table 2** below lists the goals discussed for Drive Smart for academic year 2017-2018.

With a funding source, Drive Smart is now able to make strides to thank the volunteers who dedicate their time to present. Volunteer appreciation lunches were held in both Lincoln and Omaha this year. This is an event to not only thank the volunteers, but plan for the next year's presentation and recruit new presenters.

# **Finances**

In 2017 LOCATE again carried a budget surplus, which has allowed the organization to continue its contributions to the following expenditures:

- Sponsorship of Drive Smart
- Contributions to the McCoy Scholarship Fund
- Free lunches for students attending general meetings
- Member Appreciation event
- Expenses related to the LOCATE website
- Miscellaneous meeting expenses

Annual dues and lunch costs charged to the members primarily covered the expenses related to general meetings and other operations of the Chapter, such as providing free meeting attendance (including meals) for students. 2017 was the first year in which annual member dues had increase from \$10 to \$15, as approved by a membership vote in 2016. Income from MOVITE was used to fund the other expenditures. The board again contributed to the existing Pat McCoy Scholarship fund. At the end of 2017, the Chapter's account balance was \$4,223.59. The additional income from the higher dues helped to cover the increased support provided by the Chapter (as described above), and although the year-end account balance was strong the organization suffered a net loss of \$566.35 in 2017. Most of this loss was due to a small decrease in the number of sponsors for the Student Meet and Greet event. The final 2017 Treasurer's Report, listing total expenses, revenues and reserves, is included in the **Appendix**.

With the 2017 financial information, anticipated future expenses and income were estimated to develop a Chapter budget for 2018. The 2018 Budget will be approved by the Board of Direction in early 2018 and is included in the **Appendix**.





# 2017 Annual Report

2017 was a good year for CMITE. In our eleventh year as an ITE local chapter, CMITE has a routine in place that has worked well for the size, geography, and demographic characteristics of the group. This routine includes six chapter luncheons each year, three of which are in Jefferson City, MO, and three of which are in Columbia, MO. Throughout the course of the year, we try to maximize partnerships and expand relationships with related organizations while maintaining our distinct personality as an organization. Our mix of student and professional members provides for great networking and discussion and fosters our mission of promoting transportation engineering.

Our first luncheon of 20176 was held on February 17<sup>th</sup> at the Parrish conference room at MoDOT's central office in Jefferson City. Our speaker was Shawn Leight, International President of ITE, who gave a presentation on Smart Cities, ITE, and Vision Zero. There were 24 attendees at the meeting, including three students.

The second CMITE meeting was held at the University of Missouri in Columbia on April 28<sup>th</sup>. Our speakers were Dr. Carlos Sun and Dr. Bimal Balakrishnah, both civil engineering professors at the University of Missouri. The topic was "ZouSim and iLab present 'What Do Steven Spielberg and James Cameron Have to Do with Transportation Research?" Attendees tried their hands at simulators for motor vehicles, bicycles, and wheel chairs. There were 40 attendees at the meeting, including 22 students.

The third meeting was held on June 27<sup>th</sup> in Jefferson City at a pizza restaurant. It was a joint meeting of MSPE and CMITE where the MSPE Executive Director and lobbyist Bruce Wylie gave an "Engineering Legislative Update." The total attendance including MSPE members was 30, including 7 CMITE members. No students attended this meeting.

The August meeting was held on the 31<sup>st</sup> at the Parrish conference room at MoDOT's central office in Jefferson City. Chris Engelbrecht, Emergency Management Liaison with MoDOT presented on Solar Eclipse Transportation Planning and Results. There were 14 attendees.

The annual Traffic and Safety Conference was combined with the Blueprint conference. The conference was held September 27–29 at the Holiday Inn Executive Center in Columbia, MO. The Traffic and Safety Conference is hosted by Missouri University and MoDOT. CMITE sponsored a poster session, our 8<sup>th</sup> annual, this year awarding prizes of \$100 for first place and \$50 for second. A total of 5 posters were submitted. The first place winner was "Evaluation of Automated Flagger Assistance Devices in Missouri" by Zhu Qing and Siyang Zhang, and the second place winner was "Understanding the Impacts of Work Zone Activities on Traffic Flow Characteristics" by Nipjyoti Bharadwaj and Yohan Chang. On the second night of the conference, CMITE sponsored a social hour which was attended by 20+ people.

The last meeting of the year was held on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. University of Missouri students presented their posters from the Traffic Conference at the Columbia City Hall. **Evaluation of Automated Flagging** — Zhu Qing and Siyang Zhang

They will discuss field and driving simulator performance of a new MoDOT device that automates flagging operations and improves worker safety.

**Traffic Flow Modeling of Work Zone Activities** — Nipjyoti (Nip) Bharadwaj and Yohan Chang

They will present the modeling of work zone traffic based on work zone activity type. The modeling results provide guidance for work zone planning, scheduling, and operations.

Spatial Association of GPS Data to Geographic Data — Ahmed Abdaljabbar In order to use GPS data for various types of transportation analysis, the GPS point measurements need to be matched to the corresponding transportation facilities. This process is non-trivial due to issues related to both network and GPS data.

We also recognized Charlie Nemmers, Director of the Transportation Infrastructure Center at MIZZOU Dave Mennenga, MOVITE President, presented him with the MOVITE Patrick T. McCoy Award for Education Professional of the Year. This award recognizes an individual in the academic profession who has made outstanding contributions to the advancement of transportation/traffic engineering through their dedication in higher academics and through their service to MOVITE/ITE and achievements in the transportation/traffic academic profession. There were 25 people in attendance, including eight students.

CMITE leadership rotated at the end of 2017. Frank Yates moved from the Vice President to the President role. Ray Shank moved from the Secretary/Treasurer to the Vice President. No candidates were identified for Secretary/Treasurer. This position will be filled as soon as possible in the new year. Frank and Ray will share those duties in the interim. Phil Teeple then became the Past President.

The first Advisory Committee meeting was held on December 11<sup>th</sup> at the Parrish conference room at MoDOT in Jefferson City. The Advisory Committee consists of past presidents of CMITE and other transportation leaders in the CMITE area. The Missouri Director at MOVITE is also welcome to participate in the Advisory Committee, which will meet twice a year going forward. The Advisory Committee made the following recommendation at the first meeting:

- Scheduling meetings further out
- Improving communications with undergraduate students
- Rank list of meeting ideas
- Enhance meeting announcement emails
- Improve outreach to consultants, public sector, and consultants
- Send email to mailing list for annual dues
- Establish a permanent postal mailing address
- Check on non-profit organization tax filing requirements

The total paid membership for the 2016 calendar year was 22. CMITE has a bright future ahead and a committed membership that will keep us going.

August – ICITE organized an event to shadow an Iowa Department for the Blind training session. Ten



# ANNUAL CHAPTER REPORT



### **SUMMARY**

The Arkansas Chapter of ITE (ARITE) was chartered on December 12, 2016, forming the first ITE chapter encompassing the entire state of Arkansas. The ARITE bylaws were approved by the Missouri Valley Section of ITE (MOVITE) on April 19, 2017. This document constitutes the first annual report for ARITE.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

There are 82 ARITE chapter members, all of whom are international ITE members. Fifteen of these members are student chapter members at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville.

### **ACTIVITIES**

There were six ARITE chapter meetings and one joint ARITE/MOVITE meeting in 2016-2017.

- March 2016 A meeting was held at ArDOT Central Office in Little Rock. There were 33 attendees.
   Nicci Tiner with Garver gave a presentation entitled "Intersection Sudies: Simple to Complex" and Andrew Warren with ArDOT gave a presentation entitled "Traffic Calibration for Signalized Intersections". Interest was expressed at the meeting to for an Arkansas Chapter.



### Executive Board Meetings – Summer, Fall, and Spring Semesters

The Executive Board members met on a weekly basis during the course of the academic year, starting immediately after being elected. This allowed for events, workshops, and volunteer opportunities to be planned well in advance, which was a significant change for the organization and helped to facilitate more active participation by all chapter members. ### **MEETING SUMMARIES**

### Fall Kickoff Meeting – Monday, August 28th

At the first meeting of the fall semester, twenty-three TSA members enjoyed food and a brief presentation by the new President of the organization, Ahmed AlBughdadi. The presentation focused on what to expect from the organization throughout the semester, as well as new, innovative ideas that would break from the traditional TSA format. Icebreaker activities and welcoming games were also conducted to introduce new and returning members, and to establish a sense of community within the TSA organization.

### Task Force Division Meeting - Monday, September 11th

Traditionally, TSA has conducted biweekly technical meetings throughout the semester, which featured presentations from professionals in the transportation industry who spoke about various topics of interest. Based on TSA member feedback, the Executive Board revised the meeting format and added a series of student-focused events that were suggested and voted on by the members of the organization. After the events were established, the Executive Board and student members were asked to join at least one "Task Force," which would work together to plan each desired event throughout the semester. The intent of this process was to involve TSA in more diverse activities and provide members with an opportunity to make their passions a reality. Additionally, it was decided at this meeting that the workshops and events hosted by TSA could be attended by non-TSA members for a small fee; this was another first for the organization. The intent of this was to promote collaboration between students of varying degree programs at ISU while expanding recognition of TSA at a college-wide level.

### Task Force Planning Meeting – Monday, September 25<sup>th</sup>

As mentioned previously, TSA transitioned from a biweekly technical meeting format and created a series of Task Forces to increase diversity of topics and facilitate greater student interest. Each Task Force consists of one Executive Board member and various additional TSA members. These Task Forces are responsible for planning events that were developed by a consensus of TSA members. The intent of this TSA meeting was to allow each Task Force to congregate and plan their desired event. The potential date, time, location, resources needed, and estimated budget were all decided by the Task Force members during this meeting, and the results were presented by each respective Executive Board member to the entire TSA organization.

### Poster Workshop – Monday, October 9th

TSA invited Dr. Halil Ceylan from the ISU CCEE Department to provide best practice tips and guidelines when constructing a poster for presentation at a research conference/event. During this seminar, Dr. Ceylan covered a variety of topics, ranging from how to design an effective poster, to an established method of creating a significant first impression while presenting research. A wide variety of both excellent and poor example research posters were discussed among the members in attendance with the help of Dr. Ceylan, and the session concluded with questions and answers dictated by student-driven topics.

### Python Workshop 1 – Saturday, October 28th

At the request of numerous TSA members, a series of informative, hands-on technical sessions were scheduled during the fall semester, including a multi-day Python workshop that was conducted by ISU associate professor Anuj Sharma. Dr. Sharma often utilities innovate big data techniques in his transportation research, and was consulted by TSA to provide a seminar series on the use of Python with transportation-focused data. In response, Dr. Sharma, as well as a few of his graduate research assistants, created two sessions which focused exclusively on the use and application of Python. The session started with introductory material about Python syntax and conditionals, and ended with code functions, looping algorithms, and application techniques that were useful for most of the transportation research conducted at ISU.

### Python Workshop 2 - Saturday, November 4th

This workshop was the second event hosted by Dr. Sharma and his graduate research assistants on the application of Python within a transportation context. The event was requested by TSA members and was attended by interested transportation students and computer science students alike. This was a continuation of the first workshop event, which was conducted a week prior.

### Fall TSA and ICITE Joint Meeting – Wednesday, November 8th

To promote camaraderie and strong social ties between the student-based ITE organization at ISU and the professional-based ITE organization of central Iowa, the TSA and ICITE Joint Meeting occurred in early November. The meeting began with a brief tour of the ISU Institute for Transportation (InTrans), which is the facility were a majority of the TSA members conduct their graduate-level research. The ICITE guests were given a unique look at the REaltime AnalytiCs of TranspORtation (REACTOR) lab from various research scientists at InTrans. Following this tour, three TSA members presented results from recently completed research projects, including Trevor Kirsch, Georges Bou-Saab, and Ali Nahvi. After a question and answer session with all three presenters, both ITE chapters went to a local restaurant for a networking session that reunited past and present TSA members in a social setting.





### Overview of University of Nebraska ITE Student Chapter Activities in 2017

A major goal we set out to complete in the past year was to promote better collaboration between students at the University of Nebraska at Lincoln (UNL) and the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO). The Civil Engineering degree offered through the University of Nebraska is based in Lincoln, but students are located on both Lincoln and Omaha campuses, an hour away from each other. ITE serves as a great way to bring students together from both campuses.

This effort has not been without challenges over the last year. We have relied heavily on video-connected classrooms between the two campuses. There are frequently technical difficulties that arise from these set-ups, and some of our time is spent resolving IT issues rather than presenting. The limitations with contact between members in Omaha and Lincoln has been an impediment in our creation of a single student ITE chapter. This being said, we are enthusiastic about bridging these gaps and continuing our success.

In terms of meeting activities, our main effort has been to promote the transportation field to students on campus. We sought to do this by engaging and networking with professionals from our local ITE chapter, the Lincoln, Omaha, and Council Bluffs section of ITE (LOCATE). In 2017, we attended LOCATE events, some of which were held on our campuses, as well as hosting guest speakers, and one transportation engineering job fair. In addition to these professional activities, the student chapter of ITE also organized and supported an intramural soccer team.

### **Professional Activities in 2017**

### February 15, 2017: LOCATE meeting at Peter Kiewit Institute (PKI) on the UNO campus

Kyle Anderson and Josh Palik, both of Felsburg Holt & Ullevig, presented about the elevated roundabout at 14<sup>th</sup> Street and Old Cheney Rd in Lincoln, NE. This luncheon event held in the engineering building on UNO's campus included around 30 engineers and a half-dozen student attendees.

### March 30, 2017: LOCATE job fair at Whittier Hall on UNL campus

A job fair was held on UNL's campus to connect students with the local transportation engineering consulting community. Coordination was made between LOCATE and the Traffic Engineering class at UNL, releasing students early and providing access to the event. Eight organizations participated, including Olsson, Iteris, FHU, HDR, JEO, the city of Lincoln, the city of Omaha, and the Nebraska Department of Transportation. Approximately 20 students attended the event.

### March 30, 2017: LOCATE meeting at Whittier Hall on UNL campus

Matt Baker of the Nebraska Department of Transportation presented about recent implementation of ITS projects at the state DOT. This luncheon event held in Whittier Hall on UNL's campus included around 30 engineers and a half-dozen student attendees.

### April 7, 2017: LOCATE and Nebraska ASCE joint transportation conference at Scott Conference Center on UNO campus

Twelve speakers presented at this day-long event, including speakers from the private sector, public sector, and the university. This event held on UNO's campus included around 100 engineers and an unknown number of student attendees.

### September 27, 2017: University of Nebraska ITE (UNITE) guest speaker at PKI on UNO's campus

Austin Yates, a TSMO Engineer at the Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT), came to speak about traffic incident management, his experience working for NDOT, and intelligent transportation system applications. He spoke about projects currently being done by NDOT such as running new fiber along the interstate to create a faster and more reliable ITS network across the state. He also discussed how NDOT is at the forefront of ITS application by implementing a statewide automatic gate ramp closure system during inclement weather or in the event of an accident. He even discussed his

experience as a contestant on Jeopardy! Around a half-dozen students attended in Omaha, with another dozen connected by video in Lincoln.

### October 24, 2017: University of Nebraska ITE (UNITE) guest speaker at PKI on UNO's campus

We had John Markt from HDR speak about the I-80 automated/connected vehicle study for IDOT. He analyzed traffic volumes being impacted by growing technologies and how that changes construction plans for the corridor as traffic volumes grow. They looked at different scenarios based on how well received the technologies will be based on the share of connected vehicles in operation. Around a half-dozen students attended in Omaha, with another dozen connected by video in Lincoln.

### November 15, 2017: LOCATE and Nebraska Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE) joint meeting at Thompson Center on UNO campus

Chris Rolling of Olsson Associates presented about the City of Omaha Sign Inventory Project. This luncheon event held in Thompson Center on UNO's campus included around 50 engineers and an unknown number of student attendees.

### November 20, 2017: University of Nebraska ITE (UNITE) Panel Discussion

We were joined by professionals from both the private and public sectors to discuss the topic of being successful in the transition from school to the workplace. The six speakers represented organizations including: HDR, Felsburg Holt & Ullevig, Olsson Associates, the City of Omaha, and NDOT. Our advisor Dr. John Sangster was



kind enough to provide water and cookies as refreshments. Approximately 30 students were able to attend the panel discussion, with students and speakers in both Lincoln and Omaha.

### December 15, 2017: LOCATE annual meeting in Ashland, NE

Michael Higerson from MAPA and Ralph Batenhorst from HDR presented about the Metropolitan Area Travel Improvement Study (MTIS) Update for the city of Omaha. This luncheon meeting located halfway between Lincoln and Omaha's campuses included around 50 engineers and one student attendee.

### **Social Activities in 2017**

### **ITE Intramural Soccer Team**

It is not all work in our ITE chapter.
This last fall we fielded a team of transportation grad students from the Lincoln campus to compete in the campus recreation's men's soccer league. We had over a dozen people participate. This helped facilitate community and influenced people to become involved in ITE.



### Plans for 2018

We have many goals for ITE in the upcoming year. We will be continuing our primary objective of strengthening the bond and comradery between the UNO and UNL members. To help promote this we will plan more collaborative events and get-togethers at each other's campuses. On the professional side, we are planning to attend LOCATE events, as well as hold our own guest speaker events on campus. We would like to increase or connection with the professional community; one way might be through the creation of a Traffic Bowl team that could compete against the LOCATE board. We are organizing another ITE soccer team compete in the spring league come March. Most importantly though is to keep encouraging membership growth by reaching out to younger undergraduates and help foster a community that can support one another in our common interest of the transportation field. Ultimately we would like to hold one professional and one social event each month, alternating campuses month-to-month.

Annual Report of Student Chapter Activities From 2017 to 2018

Student Chapter, Washington University in St. Louis

Last year, this chapter's goal was to overcome obstacles in scheduling that prevented student involvement. Students in the UMSL/WUSTL joint engineering program often work during the day and have classes in the evening, meaning that there is little time to schedule ITE activities.

In the first half of this year, we have overcome some (but not all) of these obstacles and have increased active student members as well as the number of student activities. 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#### Introduction

The goals of the University of Arkansas (UA) Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) Student Chapter this past year have been to increase the number of student members and engage student members with the professional community. Following a 15-year period of dormancy, the UA ITE Student Chapter seeks to revive the chapter structurally and create if not recreate the foundation on which the chapter will build on the next years. This year, the student officers were successful in registering the Chapter as an official Registered Student Organization (RSO). This allows not only for recognition by campus administration but also provides access to school funds for Chapter events.

Objectives for this year are to start engaging more with the professional chapter members in Arkansas and in the region, to increase the club's off-campus events, and get more students involved in meetings and leadership. As we wrap up an active 2017 and enter into a new year, we have planned several new events. This Spring 2018 semester we plan on attending the Student Leadership Summit in El Paso, Texas, hosted by the Southern Plains Transportation Center (SPTC), host three general meetings, and participate in the Joint International/Midwestern District/Great Lakes District Meeting in August. In addition to inviting ITE professional members as speakers to our monthly meetings, we plan to host a resume and interview seminar to prepare our student members for the STEM Career fair.

In this Annual Chapter Activities Report, you will find a description of the Chapter Organization, summaries of officer and general meetings, and highlights from two conferences in which our student chapter members participated. The report also contains the budget and provides an outlook on next year's activities. ## Chapter Organization

In this section, the history of our chapter is presented followed by a description of our organization structure and list of our officers.

#### ITE History

Although the University of Arkansas (UA) has offered a strong Civil Engineering program since 1897, it wasn't until October 29, 1993 that the ITE Student Chapter was first established under the MOVITE Section. The original student chapter advisor was Dr. Jim Gattis (Emeritus Faculty, UA). Upon its initial founding and for several years beyond, the student chapter was very active. However, the chapter became dormant over time. In 2015, the UA Civil Engineering Department hired Dr. Sarah Hernandez, who specializes in transportation systems engineering and planning. Dr. Hernandez, being a member of ITE, organized, with the help of Dr. Hall, a new student organization called Transportation Leaders of the 21st Century (TL21). TL21 is a product of the USDOT University Transportation Center (UTC) program, specifically, the Southern Plains Transportation Center (SPTC) housed at the University of Oklahoma. Dr. Hernandez proposed transitioning the TL21 group to an ITE Student Chapter in 2016. The new ITE Student Chapter created a constitution, assigned leadership roles, and began interacting with the professional ITE chapter members through monthly meetings and off-campus conferences. TL21 and ITE aiming to a similar objective. Both groups seek to introduce students to the transportation field and find ways to address current transportation issues. TL21 officers voted to re-register TL21 as ITE so that the dormant student chapter of the University of Arkansas might be revived at the start of the Spring 2017 semester. The ITE Student Chapter is now a Registered Student Organization (RSO) at the UA.

#### ITE Organizational Structure

Transportation Leaders of the 21<sup>st</sup> century (TL21) is the parent organization of the ITE Student Chapter at the University of Arkansas. All members of TL21 are encouraged to become national members of ITE, by explaining to member the importance of being a member of ITE in order to participate in ITE events such as national/regional conferences. While it is not required to be an ITE member in order to join TL21, every officer must register as a member of ITE. In addition to the faculty advisor, the leadership group consists of the following roles and responsibilities:

#### The President will:

- 1. chair all meetings of TL21 and call special meetings as needed
- 2. organize any elections associated with TL21 events
- 3. actively recruit new members on an event basis
- 4. maintain and update the constitution as necessary

#### The Vice President will:

- 1. chair any ad hoc committees or task forces of the organization
- 2. be in charge recruitment and outreach to new or continuing students
- 3. maintaining or finding a volunteer to maintain the TL21 Facebook page
- 4. manage and collect pictures of TL21 activities

#### The Secretary will:

1. create and maintain the organization's electronic membership directory that includes current names and email addresses

2. take, record, and file meetings minutes, produce all official correspondence for the organization

#### The Treasurer will:

- 1. maintain records and report on the financial transactions of TL21
- 2. develop and produce an Annual Report to SPTC, detailing TL21 activities conducted in the previous year

All officers and candidates for office must be currently enrolled, full-time students at the University of Arkansas with a minimum GPA of 2.50. Nominations for all offices open from the first week to the third week of the Spring semester. The President collects the names of the nominees and includes all nominees in the election ballot. Nominations close at the end of the third week of the spring semester. A simple majority is used to vote in new officers who were nominated by themselves or another member.

The officers are elected in the Fall semester and serve for one year. The officers for the 2017 and 2018 calendar years are as follows:

In addition to the leadership positions, the group chose to include two additional leadership positions to carry out specific goals of the group. These specific roles are referred to as "pillars" of the organization and are as follows:

#### 1. Pillar 1: Meeting with transportation leaders

Pillar I will be chaired by a student coordinator who is not serving as an officer. The student coordinator is responsible for communicating with the officers on the status and activities of the pillar. Pillar I activities will focus on two primary areas. First, invite transportation leaders to speak at TL21 meetings. Second, travel to local, regional, and state level transportation companies, agencies, and organizations to meet with transportation leaders. A key aspect of Pillar I is to expose students to transportation and leadership topics beyond the scope of typical required undergraduate courses.

#### 2. Pillar 2: Outreach

Pillar II will be chaired by a student coordinator who is not serving as an officer. The student coordinator is responsible for communicating with the officers on the status and activities of

the pillar. Pillar II will focus on three primary areas. First, visit local K-12 schools to expose students to transportation engineering concepts. Second, attend career days for local K-12 schools, Freshman Engineering Program (FEP) Informational Department Sessions, and other related informational department sessions around campus. Third, serve as active members of the transportation community on both the UA campus and the City of Fayetteville.

### Chapter activities

The ITE Student Chapter at the UA hosts several different kinds of events each year including Officer Meetings to plan and organize group events, General Meetings for all members, and student participation in regional or national events. Each are described in this section.

#### General Meetings

For the past three years, TL21 has had a general meeting, the first year (2016) the meetings were the first Thursday of every month, the second year (2017) the general meetings have been held on the second Thursday of every month, excluding January which there was no general meeting. The third year (2018) the general meetings are going to be held on the fourth Thursday of every month. Consistency in the meeting day/time is important for attracting students to the meetings. It also aids in coordination with other student groups such as ASCE and Chi Epsilon.

Most of the meetings were held on the UA Campus in Bell Engineering in room 1108G, with few in different rooms in Bell Engineering because of other conflicting meetings, at 5pm. The majority of the meetings included guest speakers who present on different transportation topics, while other meetings were voting for new officers, skill workshops or interview and resume workshops for the upcoming Career Fairs. Typically, emails were sent to the Civil Engineering Undergraduate list serve so all Civil Engineering students would have the information of the meetings. As well as the guest speakers,

TL21/ITE officers talked about upcoming external events and transportation related internship and summer job opportunities.

Starting in Fall 2017, the officers of TL21/ITE created an electronic RSVP form that was sent out with the email announcements. 


Figure 3. Flyer for the April ITE Meeting


Figure 5. Mr. Vines shows ITE members a traffic cabinet

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#### Introduction

The University of Kansas student chapter of Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) was quite active this year with activities ranging from professional development to educational forums. 




# Midwest/Great Lakes ITE Student Leadership Summit in West Lafayette, Indiana (September 15-17, 2017)

#### Introduction

The Missouri University of Science and Technology (Missouri S&T) Student Chapter for the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) had been active during the 1980s and into the early 2000s. However, the student chapter interest dwindled, as the last transportation engineering faculty left Missouri S&T in 2011. In the past year, the department has taken leadership in increasing interest in many different areas of civil engineering, including transportation. Dr. Xianbiao Hu was hired by the university to help grow this portion of the department, and one of his main goals was to revitalize the ITE Student Chapter. Together with the department chair, Dr. Joel Burken, and adjunct transportation professor Mr. Mike Sneed, the ITE student chapter has grown into an organization of 26 student members, with many more students interested, that meet for monthly seminars and for other extracurricular activities. Dr. Hu, together with the current leadership team, is committed to growing and sustaining the student chapter, and reaching out to every department on campus to show them the benefits of learning about transportation and how it impacts our lives.

#### **Seminar Summary**

<u>Introductory Seminar and Dr. Carlos Sun Presentation – "Why Turn to the Dark Side? A Civil Engineer's</u> <u>Journey into Law" – Tuesday, September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017 – 3:00 PM – 4:30 PM</u>

To begin the revitalization of the ITE Student Chapter, Dr. Hu and Dr. Burken organized an initial seminar that outlined the plans and goals for the student chapter this semester. Following the outline of the plan, Dr. Carlos Sun presented his seminar "Why Turn to the Dark Side? A Civil Engineer's Journey into Law." Dr. Sun is a professor at University of Missouri – Columbia where he teaches transportation courses for undergraduate and graduate students. He also currently serves as the Associate Director of the Transportation Infrastructure Center at the University of Missouri – Columbia. In this seminar, Dr. Sun, who has a juris doctorate, discussed how law intersects with the working civil engineer, specifically in transportation. His presentation included the legal aspects of ridesharing, automated traffic enforcement, and environmental compliance in transportation.

Elections - October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017 - 12:30 PM - 1:00 PM

Following elections, the officers met to discuss plans for the semester. Interested students were polled to see when the best meeting time worked for seminars for all students, and seminars were scheduled accordingly. The constitution was developed for the new organization for university purposes.

<u>Preston Kramer (MoDOT Engineer) and Darin Pryor (City Engineer of Rolla, Missouri) Presentation – Thursday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2017 – 6:00 PM – 7:00 PM</u>

For the student chapter's first seminar with an official officer board, Preston Kramer, a MoDOT Engineer, and Darin Pryor, the City Engineer of Rolla, MO, presented as a joint ITE-MSPE meeting. Together, they discussed the issue of funding for transportation projects. Mr. Kramer presented an overview on the transportation system of MoDOT and Missouri, and Mr. Pryor discussed upcoming projects in the Rolla area, including the Route 72 extension, which is a major future project for the Rolla area. Together, they discussed the unfunded transportation needs and alternative funding solutions involved in projects on which they work. Dr. Burken also discussed the Missouri Society of Professional Engineers (MSPE) and how students could be involved with the organization.

<u>Dr. Xianbiao Hu – "Building a Connected Mobility Management and Analytics-Centered Smarter</u> Transportation System" – Monday, December 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017 – 4:00 PM – 5:00 PM

The final student chapter presentation was presented by Dr. Xianbiao Hu, the student chapter's advisor and assistant professor in transportation at Missouri S&T. In this presentation, Dr. Hu presented a large focus of his research, which involved detecting real time traffic conditions using Active Traffic and Demand Management (ADTM) strategies. Through this research and algorithms, Dr. Hu developed Metropia, a smartphone app that helps track real time traffic data that assists with the real time traffic conditions. Dr. Hu also discussed how urban transportation system efficiency and safety has been enhanced by influencing personal travel behavior decisions.

At the end of the meeting, Dane Seiler from MOVITE provided a brief presentation on MOVITE and how students could get involved with MOVITE.

<u>Geoffory A. Grigg – MoDOT Traffic Specialist Job Presentation – Monday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2018 – 4:00 PM – 5:00 PM</u>

The first student chapter seminar of the Spring 2018 semester was presentation by recent Missouri S&T alumnus Geoffory A. Grigg, who currently works for the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) in St. James, MO as a Traffic Specialist. He discussed his daily job tasks, including call reports, pulling and analyzing crash data, signal timing studies, and traffic speed studies. He also discussed the opportunities for students that were interested in working for MoDOT.

#### **Campus Outreach**

With the student chapter being new, outreach has been a focus for the student chapter this year. Support from advisor Dr. Xianbiao Hu and department chair Dr. Joel Burken have been instrumental in the growth and sustained success of the chapter. The chapter has been involved with planning activities with the Civil, Architectural, and Environmental Engineering Department on campus this past semester. The student chapter presented at a New Student Reception for the department, and at Spring O'Rama (a biannual campus event that advertises organizations to new students or students who wish to join a new organization) to show new students to the department what the organization has to offer. In addition, support from professors has aided in the recognition of the organization on campus.

#### **Other Activities**

The student chapter has not taken any field trips or participated in public service or social activities with active professionals. The student chapter has done an exceptional job with presenting the students on campus with the resources and information with transportation jobs and promoting the organization itself. As the chapter grows, additional chapter activities will be scheduled.

#### **Fundraising**

The student chapter has received funding from the chapter advisor Dr. Xianbiao Hu, and from the Civil, Architectural, and Environmental Engineering Department at Missouri S&T. Additionally, MOVITE, the regional ITE chapter, provided \$250 to help S&T reestablish the ITE student group. With the funding from different sources, the student group is in a good position financially.

#### **External Liaison Activities**

The Missouri S&T ITE Student Chapter has begun to get involved with external activities outside of the university. While no members have attended external ITE meetings and no papers or articles have been submitted for publishing by members of ITE in the category of transportation engineering, the student members of ITE have been made aware of these opportunities. As the transportation department at Missouri S&T grows, the chapter believes that members will begin to get involved with ITE at the regional and even national levels in terms of meeting attendance and publishing submissions.

The regional ITE chapter (MOVITE) has provided exceptional encouragement with the budding chapter. Dane Seiler, the Missouri Director for MoVITE visited S&T campus and attended the seminar on December 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017. He brought the good news that MOVITE has discussed providing some financial support to reinvigorate the ITE student chapter at Missouri S&T and offered \$250.00 to help with that effort. The student chapter is appreciative the help from MOVITE.

While collaborations with the regional and national ITE levels have been limited, the Missouri S&T ITE chapter and Missouri Society of Professional Engineers (MSPE) has been active in collaborating in the 2017 fall semester. MSPE is the only professional engineering society in Missouri and represents all areas of practicing engineering disciplines in the state of Missouri. The November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2017 seminar was a joint ITE-MSPE seminar with two MSPE speakers Preston Kramer and Darin Pryor. The presentation attracted a total of over 40 audience, including not only students from civil, architectural and environmental engineering department, but also students from the engineering management and system engineering department, in addition to civil engineering professionals from the Rolla area, including MoDOT and private consulting firms. Additionally, on December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2017, ITE also sponsored MSPE in holding a local meeting in Rolla, where over 20 transportation engineering professionals participated. Bob Gilbert from Bartlett & West presented on the use static and mobile LiDAR for survey collection on civil and transportation projects.

#### 3. CAMPUS AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Our student chapter is committed to services on campus and in our communities. During the academic year, we were engaged in engineering education outreach programs to create awareness among K-12 and college students about careers in the engineering profession.

#### 3.1 Lab Tour for Academy of Early Childhood Learning (Preschool)

This event was run for the Academy of Early Childhood Learning, which is a local preschool. Through this event, our student chapter members offered children an opportunity to get to know ongoing research topics and enhance their interest in transportation engineering. Age appropriate demonstrations and topics were discussed with the students, primarily dealing with safety and traffic awareness. Furthermore, we discussed the roles of engineers in society as well as the differences between engineering disciplines. The kids were very receptive to our simulation labs as shown in the pictures below. The primary goals were to introduce the children to the role of an engineer and the importance of traffic safety.





#### 3.2 ZouSim Lab Tour for Benton STEM Elementary School Student (5th Grade)

Benton STEM Elementary is local Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade school with a STEM-based curriculum. The entire fifth-grade class (60 kids) had the chance to tour our labs and talk about college opportunities. We had the kids cycle through 4 different presentations; safety, our car simulator, coding, and our wheelchair simulator to get an idea of the capabilities and goals of our lab. The safety, coding and the wheelchair simulator presentations are pictured below. We discussed what role engineers play in society, with a focus on civil engineering in general. We also talked about how engineers attempt to solve problems and how they decide on their solutions. As a part of the simulator lab, we showed the kids our simulator codes and a "look under the hood" so to speak on several of our projects that we had in development. Each presentation given was intended to be interactive, entertaining and age appropriate in order to inspire these kids to set college goals and spark their interest in engineering. Lastly, we have also done similar presentations in the classrooms at a few other local elementary schools.







#### 3.3 National Summer Transportation Institute (NSTI) Program (High School)

Last summer, our chapter also hosted an NSTI day in which local high schoolers toured the lab and participated in some college prep. The focus of this tour and presentation was to introduce high schoolers that were interested in transportation engineering to our research projects. All of these students were college bound, so our main goal was to encourage their interest in transportation engineering. One of the high schoolers, Jacob Coberly, was recruited to be our high school intern and has continued to work with our simulator lab throughout the school year.


